



CHAPTER 130

An Act to authorize Adélard Lacasse to practise the profession of optician and optometrist

[Assented to, the 11th of March, 1926]

WHEREAS Adélard Lacasse, of the city of Quebec, has, Preamble.
by his petition, represented:

That for the past eighteen years he has exercised the profession of optician and optometrist;

That a private corporation, known under the name of the Association of Opticians of Quebec, was created by the act 6 Edward VII, chapter 89;

That, by the act 9 Edward VII, chapter 130, it was enacted that any person practising optometry in this Province in 1909 was entitled, without examination, to obtain a certificate of registration and a license from the council of the said association;

That, through an error, the certificate of registration and the license have not been granted to the petitioner;

That the petitioner has continued to practise uninterruptedly his profession since the passing of the said act;

That by the act 4 George V, chapter 120, the name of such association was changed to that of "The Association of Optometrists and Opticians of the Province of Quebec";

That the petitioner desires to be admitted as a member of such association and to continue to practise his profession in the Province of Quebec;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed for the passing of an act to that effect; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant such prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Association of Optometrists and Opticians of the Admission

of Adélarde Lacasse to practise optometry, after examination. Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Adélarde Lacasse amongst its members and to grant him a certificate of registration and a license to practise optometry in this Province, after examination.

Coming into force. **2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
