

- Erection of buildings. "6. The corporation may erect such buildings as it may deem suitable for its purposes, and establish, in conformity with the conditions and formalities required by law and the regulations of the Board of Health of the Province of Quebec, a cemetery upon its property or a vault in one of its chapels, for the disposal of the mortal remains of the members or benefactors of the corporation, or of any other person in any way connected with the corporation.

ment. "7. The corporation may manage and administer its affairs by its council, elected and appointed in accordance with its constitution and by-laws.

in C. "10. The corporation shall transmit to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, annually in the month of January, and whenever thereunto required, a statement of the property held by the corporation, the names of its officers, and a copy of its rules and by-laws."

C H A P. 121

An Act to amend the charter of the Corporation of the College of Valleyfield

[Assented to, the 3rd of April, 1925]

Preamble. **W**HEREAS the College of Valleyfield, incorporated by the act 60 Victoria, chapter 89, has represented that it is expedient to change its name to "Seminary of Valleyfield" and to ratify and confirm a deed of agreement and undertaking between the said corporation and the school commissioners for the municipality of Salaberry de Valleyfield; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant its petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The first paragraph of section 1 of the act 60 Victoria, 60 Viet., c. chapter 89, is replaced by the following paragraph: 89, s. 1, am.

“**1.** A corporation is hereby constituted in the town of Incorpora-
Salaberry de Valleyfield, in the county and district of tion.
Beauharnois, under the name of the “Seminary of Valley-Name.
field”, which shall consist of the Roman Catholic Bishop of
Valleyfield, of a superior and of not more than six other
priests as directors, all residing in the diocese of Valley-
field.”

2. The deed of agreement and undertaking between the Deed of

field, passed on the 28th of August, 1924, before J. Donat
Salomon Tremblay, notary, of Valleyfield, under the num-

legal purposes.

CHAP. 122

An Act to incorporate Lower Canada College

[Assented to, the 4th of March, 1925]

WHEREAS the St. John's School Company, of Mon-Preamble.
treal, a body politic, hereinafter referred to as the “old
corporation”, incorporated by Letters Patent issued of
date September 17th, 1908, under the Quebec Companies'
Act, 1907; Charles S. Fosbery, master of arts, school-
master, of Montreal; the Old Boys Association of Lower
Canada College Incorporated; Brooke Claxton, advocate;
Frank S. B. Heward, engineer; Allan M. Mitchell, manu-
facturer, and Harry O. Young, sales manager, all of the
city of Montreal, have by their petition represented:

That since the year 1909 the old corporation has, under
the headmastership of the said Charles S. Fosbery, con-
tinuously conducted a school for boys under the name of
Lower Canada College;

That the old corporation has acquired and owns certain
immoveable properties in Notre-Dame-de-Grâces ward, in
