

thereat, shall at and from that time only cease to have force; provided always that twenty or more members of the corporation shall have the right at all times to call a special meeting of the corporation for the transaction of any business specified in such writing, requisition or notice as they may issue to that effect; and such by-laws, rules and regulations shall have the same force and effect as if they were embodied in this act; and copies thereof purporting to be signed by the president and secretary of the corporation, shall be received as *prima facie* evidence thereof in all courts of justice."

Coming into force. **6.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

C H A P. 120

An Act to amend the charter of *L'Hôpital Français*

[Assented to, the 15th of March, 1924]

Preamble. **W**HEREAS *L'Hôpital Français*, incorporated by the act 10 George V, chapter 136, has, by its petition, represented:

That it requires certain amendments to its charter for the sake of the better administration of its affairs, and in order to achieve more adequately the object for which it was incorporated;

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer to that effect contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

10 Geo. V, c. 136, s. 4, replaced. **1.** Section 4 of the act 10 George V, chapter 136, is replaced by the following:

Purposes for which the corporation is created. **"4.** The purposes for which the corporation is created by this act are:

To admit sick persons of French nationality as indigent patients, subject to the restrictions and rules which may be fixed by the by-laws of the corporation;

To give medical advice and medicine to the indigent in accordance with the rules which may be established by the said by-laws;

To admit sick persons and take care of the same, subject to the restrictions and charges which may hereafter be determined and prescribed by the said by-laws;

To give aid to persons applying for the same on account of accident;

To give instruction respecting medicine, surgery, and nursing of the sick;

The establishment or acquisition and the management of houses for incurables or the infirm, or sanatoria for the treatment of tuberculosis or other diseases, or convalescent homes or institutions of the same kind;

To train nurses and maternity assistants, grant them diplomas or certificates of competence as such, after the fulfilment of the formalities and conditions required by the by-laws therefor."

2. The head office of the corporation shall be in the city Head office.

C H A P. 121

An Act to incorporate *La Crèche St-Vincent-de-Paul*

[Assented to, the 15th of February, 1924]

WHEREAS Dames Marie-Anna Loignon, in religion Preamble.

Marie de Saint-Pierre-Damien; Azilda Lajoie, in religion Marie de Sainte-Augustine; Lydia Paradis, in religion Marie de Saint-Thomas; Edith Hearn, in religion Marie de Saint-Patrice de Jésus; Marie-Ange Létourneau, in religion Marie du Cœur Immaculé; all five of *La Congrégation des Sœurs Servantes du Cœur Immaculé de Marie*, called "The Good Shepherd's Asylum of Quebec", duly incorporated by the act 18 Victoria, chapter 233, and amendments thereto, and respectively superioress, assistant, counsellor, *économe* and secretary of the institution commonly known by the name of *La Crèche St-Vincent-de-Paul*, have, by their petition, represented:

That for the sake of the better development of their institution, and in order to devote thereto all their resources obtained from the generosity of the public, it is necessary to create them a distinct corporation;

That the petitioners have obtained the consent of His Eminence the Cardinal Archbishop of Quebec;

That the Council of the *Sœurs Servantes du Cœur Immaculé de Marie*, called The Good Shepherd's Asylum of Quebec, has also given its consent, on the condition that the new corporation shall assume all the obligations in relation
