

3. Within thirty days from the date of the proclamation mentioned in section 1, the secretary of the above-mentioned trust shall transmit to the Minister of Public Works and Labour all documents, records, registers, archives and vouchers in his possession in his said quality, and this, under the penalty of a fine of twenty-five dollars per day for each day during which he refuses or neglects, after the expiry of such delay, to comply with the instructions of the said Minister in this connection.

4. From and after the date fixed in the said proclamation, the Minister of Public Works and Labour shall, for the purposes of this act, be vested with all the rights of the above-mentioned trustees, and may exercise all their powers.

C H A P. 13

An Act to amend the Revised Statutes, 1909, respecting
the territorial division of the Province

[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Title first of the Revised Statutes, 1909, comprising articles 60 to 80, inclusive, is replaced by the following:

“TITLE I

“TERRITORIAL DIVISION

“CHAPTER FIRST

“BOUNDARY BETWEEN THE PROVINCES OF QUEBEC AND
ONTARIO

“WHEREAS, by an order of His Majesty’s Privy Council, bearing date the month of August, in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one, it was ordained that the then Province of Quebec should be divided into two distinct Provinces, to be called the Province of Upper Canada, and the Province of Lower

Canada, by separating the said two Provinces according to the following line of division, as set forth in the royal proclamation of the eighteenth of November, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-one, viz: "To commence at a stone boundary on the north bank of the lake St. Francis, at the cove west of Pointe au Bodet, in the limit between the township of Lancaster and the seigneurie of New Longueuil, running along the same limit in the direction of north thirty-four degrees west, to the westernmost angle of the said seigneurie of New Longueuil, thence along the northwestern boundary of the seigneurie of Vaudreuil, running north twenty-five degrees east, until it strikes the Ottawa river, to ascend the said river into the lake Tomiscanning, (*Témiscamingue*), and, from the head of the said lake, by a line drawn due north until it strikes the boundary line of Hudson's Bay, including all the territory to the westward and southward of the said line, to the utmost extent of the country commonly called "or known by the name of Canada"; and whereas the point to be regarded as the head of lake Temiscamingue has never been authoritatively determined, and, in consequence, that portion of the boundary line between the Provinces of Lower and Upper Canada, now respectively named the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, north of the said lake, has never been defined; and whereas it was considered expedient by the Governments of the said Provinces of Quebec and Ontario, that the said undetermined portion of the said boundary line between the said Provinces should no longer continue uncertain, and it was, subject to ratification by the Legislatures of the said Provinces and by the Parliament of Canada, agreed between the Governments of the said Provinces, that the point at the head of lake Temiscamingue, from which the said boundary line shall run due north, should be determined in the following manner, that is to say:

1. That a line should be surveyed running due east from a monument planted on the east bank of the river Blanche, the position of which monument is upon a map showing the proposed boundary, signed in duplicate by the Honourable Pierre Fortin, formerly Commissioner of Crown Lands of the Province of Quebec, and the Honourable Richard William Scott, formerly Commissioner of Crown Lands of the Province of Ontario, and filed in the Department of Lands and Forests of the Province of Quebec, shown and marked with the letter H; and that the said due east line should be continued to the west bank of the river Quinze;

2. That the said line so surveyed should be divided into two equal parts, and that, at the point of bisection, a permanent monument should be planted;

3. That, from the said point of bisection, a line should be run due south through the mainland and through the island marked upon the said map as Island No. 2, until the said line intersects the southern boundary of the said island, at the water's edge, and that the said point of intersection of the said line with the southerly boundary of the said Island No. 2, at the water's edge, should be the point at the head of lake Temiscamingue from which the boundary line between the said Provinces of Quebec and Ontario should be run due north;

And, whereas the Governments of the said Provinces of Quebec and Ontario have caused the said lines to be surveyed, and the said point to be determined upon the ground, and have also caused to be completed (from the mouth of the river Matawan) a survey of the shores of the river Ottawa and of lake Temiscamingue on both sides, and of the islands therein situated up to the point determined in the manner aforesaid at the head of lake Temiscamingue, and thence due north to the height of land dividing the waters, tributaries of the river St. Lawrence, from those, tributaries of Hudson's Bay;

And whereas the said Governments intend to have the survey so made, marked and laid down upon a map, to be signed conjointly by the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Province of Quebec, and by the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Province of Ontario;

And whereas, by chapter 28 of the acts of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the session held in the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, and intituled: "An Act respecting the establishment of Provinces in the Dominion of Canada," it is enacted: "that the Parliament of Canada may, from time to time, with the consent of the Legislature of any Province of the said Dominion, increase, diminish or otherwise alter the limits of such Province, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed to by the said Legislature, and may, with the like consent, make provision respecting the effect and operation of any such increase or diminution, or alteration of territory in relation to any Province affected thereby";

And whereas, it is expedient that the said line so surveyed and laid down should be established as the boundary line between this Province and the Province of Ontario;

"60. The Legislature of Quebec hereby consents that the Parliament of the Dominion of Canada do declare and establish the line surveyed, marked and laid down in the manner aforesaid, due north to the northerly limits of the said Provinces, as the boundary line between this Prov-

"CHAPTER SECOND

"NORTHWESTERN, NORTHERN AND NORTHEASTERN LIMITS OF THE PROVINCE

Preamble.

WHEREAS the act 34-35 Victoria, chapter 28, of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled: "An Act respecting the establishment of Provinces in the Dominion of Canada" enacts that the Parliament of Canada may, from time to time, with the consent of the Legislature of any Province, increase, diminish or otherwise alter the limits of such Province, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed to by the said Legislature, and may, with the like consent, make provision respecting the effect and operation of any such increase, diminution or alteration of territory;

Whereas it has been agreed, between the Government of Canada and that of this Province, that the northwestern, northern and northeastern limits of the Province of Quebec, should be those hereinafter indicated, and it is expedient to give effect to such agreement;

61. The Legislature of the Province of Quebec hereby consents that the Parliament of the Dominion of Canada do declare that the northwestern, northern and northeastern limits of the Province of Quebec be the following:

"Commencing at the head of lake Temiscamingue, thence along the eastern boundary of the Province of Ontario due north to the shore of the part of Hudson's Bay commonly known as James' Bay; thence northeasterly following upon the said shore to the mouth of the East Main river; thence easterly ascending along the middle of the said river up to the confluence of the branch thereof flowing from Patamisk lake; thence ascending along the middle of the said branch up to Patamisk lake; thence along the middle of the said lake to the most northerly point thereof, the said point being about fifteen miles south from the Hudson's Bay Company's post on lake Nichigun, and approximately in latitude fifty-two degrees, fifty-five minutes north, and longitude seventy degrees, forty-two minutes west of Greenwich; thence due east along the parallel of latitude of the said point to the intersection of the river discharging the waters of lake Ashuanipi, which river is known under the names of Hamilton or Ashuanipi or Great Esquimaux river; thence descending along the middle of the said river through Menihék, Marble, Astray and Dyke lakes to the

most southerly outlet of Dyke lake; thence along the middle of the said outlet to Birch lake, and thence along the middle of Birch and Sandgirt lakes to the most southerly outlet of Sandgirt lake; thence along the middle of the southern channel of the Hamilton river to Flour lake; thence along the middle of Flour lake to its outlet, and thence along the middle of the Hamilton river to the Bay du Rigolet or Hamilton Inlet; thence easterly along the middle of the said bay or inlet until it strikes the westerly boundary of the territory under the jurisdiction of Newfoundland; thence southerly along the said boundary to the point where it strikes the north shore of the Anse Sablon, in the gulf of St. Lawrence, the said line being shown in red as far as as Hamilton Inlet, upon the plan accompanying the copy of the Order of the Governor-General in Council No. 2623, dated the eighth July, 1896, transmitted to the Lieutenant-Governor of this Province, and now deposited among the archives of the Provincial Secretary. “CHAPTER FOURTH

“ORGANIZATION OF TERRITORIES

“SECTION I

“THE TERRITORIES OF ABITIBI, MISTASSINI AND ASHUANUPI.

“**74.** All the territory of the Province between the north boundary of the electoral district of Abitibi, the northwest boundary of each of the electoral districts of Lake St. John and Chicoutimi, the north boundary of the electoral district of Saguenay, and the west, northwest, north and northeast frontier lines of the Province, as defined by the act of the Parliament of Canada, 61 Victoria, chapter 3, and the act of the Legislature, 61 Victoria, chapter 6, is divided into three territories known and designated under the names of the territory of Abitibi, the territory of Mistassini and the territory of Ashuanipi. R. S. (1909), 76; 2 Geo. V, c. 9, s. 61.

“**75.** Such three territories are described as follows: Description.
Boundaries
of Abitibi;

1. The territory of Abitibi is bounded to the north and west by the boundary lines of the Province, to the northeast by the territory of Mistassini, to the east by the height of land dividing the waters which flow into the St. Lawrence River basin from those which flow into the Hudson's Bay basin, and to the south by the parallel of latitude starting

at the one hundredth mile post planted on the interprovincial line between Quebec and Ontario.

Such territory so bounded comprises the James Bay basin, less the part thereof comprised in the electoral districts of Abitibi and Temiscamingue and less also the part watered by the rivers East Main and Rupert.

Mistassini;

2. The territory of Mistassini is bounded on the north and west by the limits of the Province; on the southwest by the new territory of Abitibi, and on the southeast by the electoral districts of Chicoutimi and Lake St. John.

The territory so bounded includes the basin of the East Main river and that of Rupert river.

Ashuanipi.

3. The territory of Ashuanipi is bounded on the north, east and west by the limits of the Province; and on the south and southwest by the electoral district of Saguenay.

The territory so bounded includes the basin of the river Ashuanipi, Hamilton or Esquimaux, as well as all other parts of territory watered by water-courses flowing directly towards the Atlantic. R.S. (1909), 77; 2 Geo. V, c. 9, s. 62.

Laws in force in territories.

“76. The laws and regulations in force in the Province are and shall be in force in the said territories, in so far as they may apply and in so far as not modified or amended by competent authority.

Suspension of fish and game laws, etc.

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, however, suspend, in the said territories, in whole or in part, and for such time as may be thought proper, the hunting and fishing laws, and may make, amend and repeal such regulations respecting these matters as he may deem necessary. R.S. (1909), 78.

What the territories of Abitibi, etc., form part of, for certain purposes.

“77. For judicial purposes, the territory of Abitibi forms part of the district of Abitibi, and for registration purposes, of the Abitibi registration division; the territory of Mistassini forms part of the judicial district of Chicoutimi and of the registration division of Lake St. John No. 2; and the territory of Ashuanipi forms part of the judicial district of Saguenay and of the registration division of Saguenay. R.S. (1909), 79; 2 Geo. V, c. 9, s. 63; 7 Geo. V, c. 14, s. 28; 11 Geo. V, c. 13, s. 16, § L.

Appointment of justices of the peace.

“78. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, by commission, appoint one or more persons, resident in any of the said territories, as justices of the peace, with jurisdiction over all such territories or over that one or those which he shall be pleased to indicate.

Qualifications.

The persons so appointed shall be British subjects of the full age of twenty-one years but need not possess any of the other qualifications required of justices of the peace.

Article 3363 shall apply to such justices of the peace. R. R.S., 3363 S. (1909), 80. to apply.

“SECTION II

“THE TERRITORY OF NEW QUEBEC.

“**79.** All the territory of the Province bounded by a line:—^{Boundaries of territory.} “commencing at the point at the mouth of East Main river where it empties into James Bay, the said point being the western termination of the northern boundary of the Province of Quebec, established by the act of the Parliament of Canada, 61 Victoria, chapter 3, and the act of the Legislature, 61 Victoria, chapter 6; thence northerly and easterly along the shores of Hudson’s Bay and Hudson’s Strait; thence southerly, easterly and northerly along the shore of Ungava Bay and the shore of the said strait; thence easterly along the shore of the said strait to the boundary of the territory over which the Island of Newfoundland has lawful jurisdiction; thence, southeasterly along the western boundary of the said last mentioned territory to the middle of Bay du Rigolet or Hamilton Inlet; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the Province of Quebec, as established by the said acts, to the point of departure,”—and as defined by the act of the Parliament of Canada, 2 George V, chapter 45, and the act of the Legislature, 2 George V, chapter 7, shall constitute a territory called “New Quebec”. 3 Geo. V, c. 13. s. 1. Name.

“**80.** The laws and regulations in force in the Province of Quebec, are and shall be in force in such territory in so far as applicable and in so far as they are not changed or amended by competent authority. ^{Laws, etc., governing territory.}

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, however, suspend, in such territory, in whole or in part and for such time as may be thought proper, the hunting and fishing laws, and may make, amend and repeal such regulations respecting these matters as he may deem necessary. ^{Suspension of certain laws, etc.} 3 Geo. V, c. 13, s. 2.

“**80a.** For judicial purposes, New Quebec shall form part of the district of Quebec, and for registration purposes, the registration division of Quebec. ^{Judicial and of registration arrangements.} 3 Geo. V, c. 13, s. 4.

“**80b.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may separate New Quebec from the district of Quebec for the purposes of coroners’ inquests, and may appoint one or more coroners for such territory with such exclusive or concurrent territorial jurisdiction as he may think proper to assign ^{Coroners’ inquests, etc.}

him or them. He may also, if the needs of administration so require, re-unite said territory to the district of Quebec, or unite it to any other district for the purposes of such inquests. 3 Geo. V, c. 13, s. 5.

Justices of the peace.

“**80c.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, by commission, appoint one or more persons, residing in the Province, justices of the peace, with such exclusive or concurrent territorial jurisdiction as he may be pleased to assign him or them.

Their qualifications.

Except that the persons appointed justices of the peace must be British subjects and of the age of majority, it is not necessary that they should have the other qualifications required of justices of the peace.

R.S., 3363 to apply.

Article 3363 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, shall apply to such justices of the peace.” 3 Geo. V, c. 13, s. 6.

R. S., 3109, am.

2. Article 3109 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, as amended by the acts 1 George V (1st session), chapter 8, section 14, paragraph I; 2 George V, chapter 9, section 74; 2 George V, chapter 33, section 1; 9 George V, chapter 12, section 9, and 12 George V, chapter 59, section 1, is again amended:

a. By inserting therein, after the word: “of”, in the fifth line thereof, the word “Abitibi”;

b. By inserting therein, after the word: “Hull”, in the seventh line thereof, the word: “Papineau”.

Electoral lists in territories affected.

3. The electoral lists now in force in the territories which undergo changes by this act shall continue to be in force and shall be used in the territory for which they were made, whether such territory has been erected into a new electoral district, or detached from one district and annexed to another, or divided into two separate districts.

Meaning of “county”.

4. In any act, proclamation, order-in-council or document whatsoever, the word “county”, meaning a county for electoral purposes, shall mean an electoral district.

Certain new electoral districts to remain subject to B. N. A. Act, s. 80.

5. The new electoral districts of Pontiac, Hull, Papineau, Témiscamingue, Abitibi and Labelle, bounded or created by this act, shall remain subject, severally, as to future alterations in their boundaries, to the provisions of section 80 of the British North America Act, 1867.

Coming into force.

6. This act shall come into force on such date as the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may be pleased to fix by proclamation. *
