An Act to amend the Civil Code respecting the confinement of habitual drunkards

[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

C. C., 336jj,
added.

1. The following article is inserted in the Civil Code after article 336j thereof, as contained in article 5790 of the Revised Statutes of Quebec, 1888:

Confine-
ment of ha-
bitual
drunkard,
instead of
interdiction.

“**336jj.** The judge may of his own motion, instead of ordering the interdiction, order the confinement of such habitual drunkard, in an establishment for habitual drunkards, for such space of time as may be deemed necessary.”

Coming into
force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

C H A P. 72

An Act to amend article 2036 of the Civil Code

[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 2036 of the Civil Code, as replaced by the act 6 Edward VII, chapter 41, section 1, is amended by adding thereto the following paragraph:

Exercise of
judicial hy-
pothec in
alimentary
pension.
Radiation
may be or-
dered.

“In the case of judgment for alimentary pension, the Superior Court, upon petition therefor on behalf of the party against whom the judgment was rendered, may, from time to time, determine the immoveable or immoveables of the debtor upon which the judicial hypothec may be exercised, and order, at the costs of the petitioner, the radiation of any such hypothec taken or registered in conformity with the provisions of this article.”

Coming into
force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
