An Act to amend articles 48, 54 and 551 of the Code of Civil Procedure

[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 48 of the Code of Civil Procedure, as enacted C. C. P., art. 48, am. by the act 10 George V, chapter 79, section 1, is amended, by inserting therein, after the word: "Canada", in the fourth line thereof, the words: "and particularly in all suits or actions for alimentary pension".

2. Article 54 of the Code of Civil Procedure, as enacted C. C. P., art. 54, am. by the act 10 George V, chapter 79, section 1, is amended by replacing the words: "in article 55", in the third line of paragraph 1 thereof, by the words: "in articles 48 and 55".

3. Article 551 of the said Code is replaced by the follow- C. C. P., art. 551, replaced. ing:

"551. In suits for alimentary pension, the costs shall be taxed in conformity with the tariff of the Circuit Court whenever the amount claimed is under two hundred dollars, and, in any event, no more costs can be allowed to the plaintiff than in an action for the monthly pension granted." Taxation of costs in suits for alimentary pension.

C H A P. 77

An Act to amend articles 55 and 1142 of the Code of Civil Procedure

[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

the District Magistrate's Court

"61. The District Magistrate's Court has ultimate civil jurisdiction to hear and determine:

1. All suits, whether personal or real, wherein the sum claimed or value of the thing demanded does not exceed ninety-nine dollars and ninety-nine cents;

2. All suits for the recovery of school-rates, taxes, assessments or contributions, or of rates, taxes, assessments, penalties, damages or sums of money whatever, due or payable in virtue of the Municipal Code, or in virtue of any special municipal act of incorporation, or in virtue of any by-laws
