## CHAP. 89

An Act to amend the Municipal Code respecting expro-  
priations for municipal purposes

*[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]*

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the  
Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly  
of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The Municipal Code is amended by inserting therein, Mun. Code,  
after article 787 thereof, the following: 787a,  
added.

**"787a.** Every municipal corporation may, for the Expropria-

## CHAP. 90

An Act to amend the charter of the city of Quebec

*[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]*

**WHEREAS** the city of Quebec has, by its petition, re-Preamble.  
presented that it is in the interest of the city and  
necessary to the proper administration of its affairs, that  
its charter, the act 29 Victoria, chapter 57, and the acts  
amending the same be amended; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant its prayer;  
Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent  
of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly  
of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The city of Quebec is hereby authorized to borrow  
a sum not exceeding five hundred and eighty thousand  
dollars to pay the cost of the following:

*a.* Two hundred thousand dollars for permanent works  
by the Waterworks Department;

*b.* Twenty-five thousand dollars for permanent side-  
walks;

*c.* Twenty-five thousand dollars for Franklin Street  
Hill;

*d.* Ten thousand dollars for Des Glacis Hill;

*e.* Twenty-five thousand dollars for the widening of  
Côte d'Abraham;

*f.* Two hundred and ninety-five thousand dollars for  
paving streets in the following wards and for the under-  
mentioned amounts:

Champlain ward: thirty thousand dollars;

St. Roch ward: fifty-five thousand dollars;

St. John ward: forty thousand dollars;

St. Sauveur ward: sixty-five thousand dollars;

Montcalm ward: fifty thousand dollars;

Jacques-Cartier ward: fifty-five thousand dollars.

**2.** To effect the loan mentioned in section 1, the city may  
issue bonds or registered stock certificates, from time to time  
when it may deem the same necessary, for the objects  
above mentioned; which bonds or stock certificates shall  
be for such sums as the city may deem suitable and shall  
be payable within a period of time not exceeding thirty  
years from the date thereof, at such rate of interest, not  
exceeding six per cent, as the council may determine.

**3.** The city may, by resolution, declare that the said  
loan shall be effected by means of short term bonds issued  
for a term of not less than two and not more than  
fifteen years, at such rate of interest, not exceeding six  
per cent, as the council may fix, with a sinking-fund of  
not less than two per cent per annum, provided that  
each issue after the first shall be only for the balance  
due on the loan.

Payment of

**4.** The city shall provide for the payment of the bonds  
or registered stock certificates, the issue whereof is au-  
thorized by section 2, either by paying on the capital of

the said bonds or registered stock certificates, half yearly or yearly, at its option, a sum sufficient so that at the maturity of each bond or certificate the capital shall be paid, or by establishing a sinking-fund, in such manner <sup>Sinking-</sup>as it may deem advisable, sufficient to pay the capital <sup>fund.</sup> at maturity; such sinking-fund shall not be used for any other purpose than the payment of the bonds or registered stock certificates.

**5.** The city is authorized to make arrangements in <sup>Renewal of</sup> advance for the renewal of its loans or for making new <sup>loans.</sup> loans for the purpose of redeeming loans about to mature, provided that such arrangements shall not be concluded <sup>Proviso.</sup> more than six months before such maturity.

**6.** Section 29 of the act 29 Victoria, chapter 57, as <sup>29 Viet., c.</sup> amended by the acts 5 George V, chapter 88, section 5; <sup>57, s. 29, am.</sup> 6 George V, chapter 43, section 5; 9 George V, chapter 89, section 7, and 12 George V, chapter 104, section 6, is again amended by adding thereto, after paragraph 11b, the following paragraphs:

"11c. To prescribe that all municipal officers are author- <sup>Fire hazard</sup> ized to enter at any time into public buildings, industrial establishments, places of amusement, hotels, apartment houses, teaching establishments, charitable institutions and all other premises or places where explosive substances, chips, refuse or other objects, articles or merchandise of a combustible nature, are placed or kept, for the purpose of ascertaining if such explosive substances, chips, refuse or other objects, articles, or merchandise are therein kept or placed in such a way as to be a source of fire hazard, in the opinion of such officers;

"11d. To order that upon the approach of any ambulance <sup>Right of</sup> or Fire Department vehicle and apparatus, patrol wagon, <sup>way to am-</sup> police wagon or wagon of a tramway and light company, <sup>bulances,</sup> in <sup>etc.</sup> the city, responding to a call, the proprietor or driver of any vehicle or motor vehicle whatsoever shall draw up to the curb on the right side and remain there until the said ambulance, vehicle or apparatus or patrol wagon shall have passed, and order that tramcars shall be brought to a stop as rapidly as possible and remain stationary to permit ambulances, vehicles or apparatus of the Fire Department or patrol wagons to pass;

"11e. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, to allow <sup>Use of</sup> the city fire wagons, police patrol wagons, patrol wagons <sup>alarm gongs,</sup> of tramway or light companies and hospital ambulances, <sup>etc., on am-</sup> to have the exclusive use of alarm gongs or sirens, the type <sup>bulances,</sup> etc.;

**7.** Paragraph 3 of section 1 of the act 33 Victoria, chapter 43, as replaced by section 10 of the act 8 Edward VII, chapter 83, and as replaced by section 14 of the act 11 George V, chapter 110, is again replaced by the following:

"3. The council may pass a by-law to the effect that the mayor shall receive each year, out of the city funds, a sum of not more than five thousand dollars, and each alderman an amount of not more than one thousand dollars per annum."

**8.** Section 15 of the act 7 George V, chapter 59, is amended by adding thereto the following paragraph:

"Moreover, the by-law shall enact that buildings to be erected on Avenue des Braves must be detached, built for a single lodging, and the most advanced portion thereof must be at a distance of not less than twenty feet from the avenue line."

**9.** The city is authorized to borrow a sum of two hundred thousand dollars for the construction of an industrial building and of an agricultural building on the Exhibition Grounds, whereof \$125,000.00 for the industrial building and \$75,000.00 for the agricultural building, the said loan to be effected under the provisions of sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

**10.** The sum of twelve thousand dollars which the city was authorized to borrow for the purchase of an asphalt plant, under paragraph *f* of section 1 of the act 6 George V, chapter 43, and which was not used, may be utilized by the city for the construction of pontons, with an additional sum of five thousand dollars, which shall also be utilized for the same purposes and which must be borrowed under the provisions of sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

**11.** The city is authorized to pay a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars for the relief of the victims of Temiscamingue in the Province of Quebec.

**12.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
