

## C H A P. 115

An Act to incorporate *L'Orphelinat St. Sauveur*

[Assented to, the 29th of December, 1922]

**W**HEREAS Dame Marie-Eugénie Roy, in religion St. Preamble.  
 Josaphat; Dame Georgiana Naud, in religion St. Onésime; Dame Alphonsine St. Pierre, in religion St. Germain; Dame Aurélie Bourassa, in religion St. Anselme; Dame Camille Aubert, in religion St. Evariste, all five of the city of Quebec, and respectively superioress, assistant, *économe*, hospitaller and secretary of the convent, hospital and orphanage maintained by the Sisters of Charity of Quebec, and commonly known under the name of the *Orphelinat de St. Sauveur*, have by their petition represented:

That for the greater development of the convent, hospital and orphanage, and for the purpose of employing, therefor, all the gifts provided by the generosity of the people of the parish of St. Sauveur of Quebec, it is necessary to incorporate it as a distinct corporation;

That the petitioners have obtained the assent of His Eminence the Cardinal Archbishop of Quebec;

That the council of the Sisters of Charity of Quebec also gives its assent, provided the new corporation gives a complete discharge to the Sisters of Charity of Quebec and assumes the obligations arising from the two deeds of agreement between them and the Reverend Oblate Fathers of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, passed, the one before L. P. Sirois, notary, at Quebec, on the 23rd of January, 1908, and the other, before Joseph Sirois, notary, at Quebec, on the 17th of May, 1922; the new corporation, however, to receive all benefits emanating from such deeds;

That the Reverend Oblate Fathers of the Immaculate Conception of Mary have given their assent to such proposed legislation being presented to the legislature;

That it is expedient to grant the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The superioress, the assistant, the *économe*, the Incorpora-

 orphanage, maintained by the Sisters of Charity of Quebec, *"L'Orpheli-

 and commonly known as the *Orphelinat de St. Sauveur*,  
 and their successors as superioress, assistant, *économe*,  
 hospitaller and secretary, appointed to the said offices

by the Council of the Sisters of Charity of Quebec, are incorporated under the name of "*L'Orphelinat St. Sauveur*".

**2.** The corporate seat of the corporation shall be in the parish of St. Sauveur of Quebec;

Powers of

**3.** The corporation shall have the powers, rights and privileges pertaining to ordinary civil corporations, and it may:

- a. Have a common seal and alter it at will;
- b. Appear before the courts;
- c. Accept, acquire and possess, according to law, rights, moveables and immoveables, provided the revenue from the immoveables belonging to the corporation and possessed by it, for revenue purposes, does not exceed one hundred thousand dollars;
- d. Administer such property and draw the revenues thereof, rent, sell, exchange, cede and alienate the same in any way whatsoever, or otherwise dispose of same;
- e. Borrow money on the credit of the corporation;
- f. Issue bonds or other securities of the corporation and give the same in guarantee or sell them at the price and amount considered advisable;
- g. Hypothecate, pledge or give in guarantee the immoveables of the corporation to assure the payment of such bonds or other securities or give a part only of these guarantees for the same object and constitute the hypothec, pledge or guarantee mentioned in this sub-paragraph by a deed of trust or in any other way;
- h. Hypothecate or pledge the immoveables to assure the payment of loans made otherwise than by bond issue as well as the payment or execution of other debts, contracts or undertakings of the corporation;
- i. Adopt, for its organization and management, for the administration of its property and the disposal of its funds, and generally for all purposes cognate to its object, for the realization of its undertaking, for the carrying out of its aims and the exercise of its powers, the by-laws and orders which it may think proper, provided they contain nothing contrary to the laws of this Province.

**4.** The corporation shall fulfil, thereby fully discharging the Sisters of Charity of Quebec, all the obligations specified in the deeds of agreement passed between them and the Reverend Oblate Fathers of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, one of such deeds, having been

passed before L. P. Sirois, notary, at Quebec, on the 23rd of January, 1908, and the other, before Joseph Sirois, notary, at Quebec, on the 17th of May, 1922, provided, however, that the corporation shall receive all benefits emanating from such deeds.

**5.** By an agreement between the corporation of the Sisters of Charity of Quebec and the Reverend Oblate Fathers of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, approved by the Archbishop of Quebec, the corporation may cede all its moveables and immoveables to the Sisters of Charity of Quebec, who shall discharge all the debts and obligations of the corporation, and, from the date of such cession, the corporation shall cease to exist.

**6.** The corporation shall forward an annual statement of its moveables and immoveables and the names of its officers to the Provincial Secretary.

**7.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

#### CHAP. 116

An Act to incorporate *L'Hôpital de Notre-Dame-de-Protection* at Ste. Marie, Beauce.

[Assented, to the 29th of December, 1922]

**W**HEREAS Mgr. Joseph Edouard Feuilletault, D. P., parish priest of Ste. Marie, Beauce, and Messrs. Edmond Savoie, Eugène Rhéaume, Hermias Dupuis, Philéas Simard, all five of Ste. Marie, Beauce, on behalf of the *fabrique* of the parish of Ste. Marie de la Beauce, have, by their petition, represented:

Whereas, by will of date the 28th of November, 1910, and codicil of the 28th of November, 1915, both passed before Alexandre Gauvreau, of the city of Quebec, notary, the deceased, Mr. Louis Bilodeau, of the city of Quebec, merchant, bequeathed the sum of twenty thousand dollars to the *fabrique* of the parish of Ste. Marie, Beauce, in trust for the said parish, to be employed by the latter to help in the construction in the said parish of an hospital or home for the sick, the aged and the orphans; this legacy to be accepted by the said *fabrique* under these conditions within the three months following the death of the testator, and the erection of the hospital to be started in the course
