CHAP. 1

An Act granting to His Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the Government for the financial years ending on the 30th of June, 1922, and on the 30th of June 1923, and for other purposes connected with the public service

[Assented to, 21st of March, 1922]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

WHEREAS it appears, by messages from His Honour Preamble.
the Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, member of Our Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Lieutenant-Governor of this Province, and the estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Government of the Province, not otherwise provided for, for the financial years ending on the 30th of June, 1922, and on the 30th June, 1923, and for other purposes connected with the public service; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, that:

1. From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of Amount
this Province, there shall and may be taken a sum, not that may be
exceeding, in the whole, one million, five hundred and taken for
year ending

the 30th of June, 1922. forty-five thousand, nine hundred and sixty-six dollars and seventy-seven cents for defraying the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of this Province, for the financial year ending on the 30th of June, 1922, as set forth in Schedule A annexed to this act.

Amount that may be taken for year ending the 30th of June, 1923. **2.** From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of this Province, a sum, not exceeding, in the whole, nine millions, two hundred and eighty-nine thousand, five hundred and fifty-five dollars and eighty-nine cents, may be taken for defraying, during the financial year ending on the 30th of June, 1923, the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, as set forth in Schedule B annexed to this act.

Payment subject to adjustment, etc. **3.** Every payment or application of moneys, appropriated by this act, shall be held to be made provisionally, and subject to all adjustment in account hereafter, in respect of the Dominion and of the Province of Ontario, and of special funds which this act may in any manner affect.

Accounts rendered to both Houses. **4.** Accounts, in detail, of all moneys expended under the authority of this act, shall be laid before both Houses of the Legislature of the Province, in conformity with article 875 of the Revised Statutes, 1909.

Accounting to His Majesty. **5.** The application of all sums expended under the authority of this act shall also be accounted for to His Majesty.

Coming into force. **6.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
