

Whereas, the Board of Governors of the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec has given its approval to the passing of an act authorizing the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit the said James Dance amongst its members and to authorize him to practice his profession after the final examination for the practise of the said profession;

Whereas the petitioner has prayer that an act be passed for the above purposes, and it is expedient to grant such prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Coll. of Quebec is, by this act, authorized to admit the said Dent. Surg. James Dance amongst its members and to grant him authorized to admit J. the necessary license to allow him to practise the pro- Dance. fession of dentistry in this Province, after the final examination for the practice of the said profession.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.

CHAP. 157

An Act to authorize the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit Chester Thompson Parker to the practice of dentistry.

[Assented to, 8th of March, 1922]

WHEREAS Chester Thompson Parker of the Township Preamble. of Leeds, county of Megantic, district of Arthabasca, Doctor of Dental Surgery, was admitted to follow and has followed a complete course of clinical studies in dentistry at the school of Dental Surgery, of McGill University at Montreal, where, after regular examination, he graduated and received the diploma of Doctor of Dental Surgery on the twelfth day of May 1920;

Whereas, through such studies and his experience, he has acquired the knowledge and title required for practising dental surgery and the necessary competence for the exercise of that profession;

Whereas, since he obtained the said diploma of Doctor of Dental Surgery, he has been prevented from undergoing the examination before the Board of Governors of the Col-

lege of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec, for practising the profession of dentistry because he had not passed the matriculation examination required by the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec for admission to the study of dentistry;

Whereas, the Board of Governors of the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec has given its approval to the passing of an act authorizing the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit the said Chester Thompson Parker amongst its members and to exempt him from passing the matriculation examination and to authorize him to practise the profession of dentistry after a final examination for the practice of that profession;

Whereas, he has, by his petition, prayed that an act be passed to that effect, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

The College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec is hereby authorized to admit the said Chester Thompson Parker amongst its members and to grant him the necessary license to practise the profession of dentist in this Province after a final examination for admission to the practice of that profession.

CHAP. 158

An Act to change the name of Nellie Blanche McGowan to Helen McGowan McKim

[Assented to, 8th of March, 1922]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Nellie Blanche McGowan, presently of the city and district of Montreal, unmarried woman of full age, is the child of the late Reverend J. R. McGowan and his wife, in their lifetime of Huntingdon, in the State of Tennessee, one of the Unites States of America, where she was born on the third day of July, 1897;

And whereas the parents of the said Nellie Blanche McGowan died in her infancy or early childhood, and she was in the year 1903 in fact adopted by the late Anson
