“**702h.** In case any public officer or employee who <sup>Officers ap-</sup>would be entitled, after the fulfilment of the necessary <sup>pointed to</sup> conditions, to a pension under the provisions of section 11, <sup>other offic-</sup>or section 11a, be appointed to any other office in respect <sup>es.</sup> of which he would likewise be entitled to a pension under the provisions of either of such sections or of any other act, then for all purposes connected with such pension the date of his appointment shall be considered as being the date at which he was appointed to such first office, and he shall continue to be governed by the provisions applicable to him at such date.”

C H A P. 21

An Act to authorize the Government of the Province to  
take out group insurance policies on the lives  
of public officers and employees

[Assented to, 19th of March, 1921]

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the  
Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly  
of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The Revised Statutes, 1909, are amended by insert- <sup>R. S. 706a-</sup>ing therein, after article 706 thereof, the section and articles <sup>706c, enact-</sup> following: <sup>ed.</sup>

“SECTION IV

“GROUP INSURANCE FOR PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

“**706a.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may <sup>Authoriza-</sup>authorize the Provincial Treasurer to take out insurance <sup>tion to take</sup> policies under the system known as “group insurance” <sup>out group</sup> upon the lives of all public officers and employees of the <sup>insurance</sup> policies.

Provincial Government or of any special class or classes thereof as he may determine, and may pay, to the insurance companies concerned, wholly or in part, the necessary premium out of the consolidated revenue fund; provided that any public officer or employee may signify his desire not to be included in any such group.

Terms and conditions.

**"706b.** Every such policy mentioned in article 706a shall apply to such group of public employees, for such amount upon the life of each employee, whether based on the amount of his salary or the length of his service or otherwise, and shall be according to such terms and conditions, as the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may from time to time determine.

Benefits payable under policies.

**"706c.** The benefits becoming due under every such policy upon the death of, or the happening of any certain event to, any employee, shall be payable to such employee or to his heirs or legal representatives, and shall be neither transferable nor subject to seizure."

Coming into force.

**2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

## CHAP. 22

An Act to amend the act respecting the Quebec Public Service Commission

[Assented to, 19th of March, 1921]

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**2.** Article 740 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, as enacted by the act 10 George V, chapter 21, section 1, is amended by replacing paragraph *j* thereof, by the following:
