1. Notwithstanding the provisions of article 7096mm of the Revised Statutes, 1909, as enacted by the act 3 George V, chapter 44, section 1, the corporate powers of the company shall lapse for non-user only in the event of its failing to commence business before the first day of July nineteen hundred and twenty three.

CHAP. 142

An Act to amend the charter of The Scottish Trust Company

[Assented to, 25th of February, 1921]

Preamble.

WHEREAS The Scottish Trust Company has by its petition represented that since the coming into force of the act 9 George V, chapter 124, the condition of financial affairs has not been such as to warrant the company commencing business, nor is there any probability of conditions improving to such an extent as to warrant the company commencing business before the 1st day of July, 1921, upon which date the corporate powers of the company would lapse for non-user under the provisions of the act 9 George V, chapter 124; and

Whereas it is necessary that certain amendments be made to the charter of the company, the act 8 Edward VII, chapter 119, as amended by the acts 7 George V, chapter 101, and 9 George V, chapter 124, for the purpose of extending the said period in so far as the company is concerned, and it is expedient to grant its prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Section 16a of the act 8 Edward VII, chapter 119, as enacted by the act 9 George V, chapter 124, section 1, is replaced by the following:

An Act to incorporate the Association of Forest Engineers
of the Province of Quebec

[Assented to, 19th of March, 1921]

WHEREAS, by their petition, Charles Borromée Guérin, Preamble.
of Quebec; J. Anthime Roy, of Quebec; Henry Roy,
of Van Bruyssel; George Boisvert, of Chandler; J. Ernest
Gravel, of Quebec, and Gustave Tessier, of Three Rivers;
all forestry engineers, have, by their petition, represented:

That they are members and form the council or board
of management of an association known under the name
of “Association of Forest Engineers of the Province of
Quebec”;

That such association was founded in Quebec on the
first of February, 1916, and that it has existed since that
date, and has fifty members;

That the object of the association is to safeguard public
interests concerning the management of the forests of the
Province of Quebec;

Whereas, in order to carry out its work, the persons
above mentioned have prayed to be incorporated with
other members of their association under the name of the
“Association of Forest Engineers of the Province of
Quebec”; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of
the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of
Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. This act may be cited under the title of “Province Short title.
of Quebec Forest Engineers’ Act”.
