

CHAP. 155

An Act to incorporate *Les Révérends Pères du Très Saint Sacrement de Québec*

[Assented to, 25th of February, 1921]

WHEREAS the Reverend Fathers Auguste Pelletier, Preamble.
Auguste Michaud and Gaudiose Labrecque, all of the city of Quebec and members of the Congregation of *Les Religieux du Très Saint Sacrement*, have, by their petition, prayed to be incorporated under the name of *Les Pères du Très Saint Sacrement de Québec*;

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petitioners;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The said Auguste Pelletier, Auguste Michaud and Gaudias Labrecque, together with all other persons residing in the archdiocese of Quebec, who form part of the Congregation of *Les Pères du Très Saint Sacrement* or may in future form part of the same in accordance with the rules, statutes and regulations thereof, are constituted a corporation under the name of *Les Pères du Très Saint Sacrement de Québec*. 2. The corporate seat of the corporation shall be in the city of Quebec. Corporate

3. The corporation shall have perpetual succession and may have a common seal, which it may alter at will. Perpetual
succession,
etc.

4. The corporation may: Powers.

a. appear before the courts;

b. with the consent and control of the Ordinary of the archdiocese of Quebec, have and exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of ordinary civil corporations;

c. acquire, receive and possess in every manner allowed by law, moveable and immoveable property of any kind whatsoever for the purposes of its work, provided, however, that the annual revenue from the immoveables owned by the congregation for revenue purposes, in any diocese whatsoever, shall not exceed thirty thousand dollars;

d. sell, alienate, lease, hypothecate, pledge or otherwise dispose of its property;

e. borrow money by means of an issue of bonds or de-

bentures; or by bills of exchange, notes to order or other commercial securities;

f. receive donations;

g. adopt rules respecting the internal administration and the management of its property, and amend or repeal such rules;

h. exercise also all the rights, powers and privileges conferred upon joint-stock companies by sub-paragraphs *b*, *c* and *d* of paragraph 1 of article 6056*f* of the Revised Statutes 1909;

i. found, establish and maintain in any places it may deem it advisable, within the limits of the archdiocese of Quebec, novitiates, juvenates, boarding-schools, schools for poor children, houses for orphan apprentices, perseverance societies for young men of the working classes, clubs, patronages, agricultural schools, and schools of arts and trades;

j. appoint officers, procurators, and administrators, and define their powers;

k. generally perform all acts and exercise all the rights required for attaining its proposed objects.

5. The corporation shall be directed and administered by a council of administration chosen from among its members.

6. The persons mentioned in section 1 of this act shall constitute a provisional council of administration, and shall have all the powers of the corporation until otherwise provided for according to the by-laws that may be adopted.

7. The corporation shall be bound, each year, to furnish the Provincial Secretary with a statement of its moveable and immoveable property, and a list of its members.

8. In the event of the dissolution of the corporation its property shall be liquidated in the manner provided by the laws then in force, and, when its debts are paid, the excess, if any, shall be handed over to the Archbishop of Quebec to be utilized in such good works as he may select.

9. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

C H A P. 156

An Act to incorporate *Les Sœurs de Jeanne d'Arc*

[Assented to, 25th of February, 1921]

WHEREAS the Reverend Sisters: Alice Caron, called Sister Joanna of the Sacred Heart; Céline Benoit, called Sister Joseph of the Sacred Heart; Edna Lacroix, called Sister Joséphine of the Sacred Heart; Alida l'Etoile, called Sister Emmanuel of the Sacred Heart; Emélida Philippon, called Sister St. Jean of the Sacred Heart, all Sisters of *Jeanne d'Arc*, have, by their petition, represented:

That they have founded at Bergerville, near Quebec, with the approval of His Eminence Cardinal L. N. Bégin, Archbishop of Quebec, an establishment of their congregation with the object of devoting themselves to serving priests and other works specially in honour of the Sacred Heart;

That in order to attain their aim, they need to acquire and own property, and for that purpose they desire to be incorporated;

Whereas they have prayed to be incorporated, and it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Reverend Sisters Alice Caron, called Sister Joanna of the Sacred Heart; Céline Benoit, called Sister Joseph of the Sacred Heart; Edna Lacroix, called Sister Joséphine, of the Sacred Heart; Alida l'Etoile, called Sister Emmanuel of the Sacred Heart; Emélida Philippon, called Sister St. Jean of the Sacred Heart, and all persons who may join or succeed them under their constitution or by-laws, are hereby incorporated under the name of: "*Sœurs de Jeanne d'Arc*".

2. The corporation shall have perpetual succession, and may have a common seal, which it may alter at will.

3. The corporation may—

Powers.

a. appear before the courts as any person may do;

b. accept, acquire and possess moveable and immoveable property, under any legal title, provided the value of the immoveables does not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars according to the municipal valuation;
