2. If any suits or proceedings in law or equity have been begun by or against the said William Harvey Green Smith under his former name, such suits or such proceedings shall not be affected, and no redress or recovery which may have been the object thereof, shall be prejudiced, on account of such change of name, but they may be continued and carried on to judgment and execution until satisfaction and acquittance are obtained, as if this act had not been passed.

Rights, etc.,
to apply to

3. All rights and privileges generally of every nature and kind whatsoever which the said William Harvey Green Smith might acquire under this act and those that might be acquired in the future under this act, shall likewise apply to his children and descendants.

Coming

4. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 194

An Act to regularize the civil status of Joseph Charles Patrice Guy *et al.*

[Assented to, 19th of March, 1921]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Etienne Charles Patrice Guy, notary, of the city of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented:

That he is unmarried and lived publicly, for about twenty years, with Marie Louise Sarrazin, spinster, as his wife, and that from this union were born two children, one of whom was a son, born on the 10th of October, 1912, and the other a daughter, born on the 28th of September, 1914;

That such two children were baptized at the Roman Catholic church of St. Louis de France, in Montreal, the son on the 12th of October, 1912, under the names of Joseph Charles Patrice Guy, son of Etienne Guy, and of Marie Louise Sarrazin, and the daughter, on the 3rd of October, 1914, under the names of Marie Rose Gabrielle Alys Guy, daughter of Etienne Guy and Marie Louise Sarrazin;

That these two children have always been publicly recognized by their father and mother, but that their father delayed having his marriage celebrated owing to the opposition of certain members of his family to the said Marie Louise Sarrazin;

That the said Marie Louise Sarrazin died suddenly, in Montreal, on or about the 8th of June, 1920, without his being able to have his marriage with her celebrated;

That he wishes to have the civil status of his children regularized;

Whereas he has, by his petition, prayed that a special act be passed to that effect; and

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Joseph Charles Patrice Guy and Marie Rose Gabrielle Alys Guy, natural children of Etienne Charles Patrice Guy, notary, of Montreal, and of the late Marie Louise Sarrazin, are by this act legitimized and authorized to exercise all the civil rights which they would have had if they had been born of the lawful marriage of their said father and mother.
