An Act respecting time

[Assented to, 14th of February, 1920]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Standard
time.

1. 1. When any expression whatsoever referring to time occurs in any act, proclamation, order in council, proceeding, by-law, contract, writing, document or agreement, written or verbal, at present in force, or which may be hereafter enacted, passed, made or agreed to, or whenever any hour or other period of time is mentioned, either orally or in writing, or any question as to a period of time arises, the time referred to or intended shall, unless it is otherwise specifically stated, be deemed to be "standard time".

2. In that part of the province which lies east of the meridian of sixty-eight degrees west longitude, standard time shall be reckoned as four hours behind Greenwich time.

In that part of the Province which lies west of that meridian, standard time shall be reckoned as five hours behind Greenwich time.

Change of
time.

2. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may make, amend or replace regulations to change the standard time as defined in section 1.

Time-tables
of public
services.

3. Such regulations may authorize the Quebec Public Service Commission to fix the time-tables of any public service under its control, and to issue any other orders necessary or expedient to that end.

Coming
into force.

4. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
