An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Jean Chauvin to the practice of the legal profession, after examination

[Assented to, 14th of February, 1920]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Jean Chauvin has, by his petition, represented:

That he is a law student at Montreal, having been admitted to the study of law, (a) in letters in July, 1915; (b) in sciences in July, 1919;

That he was indentured as a student with Mr. M. Pouliot on the 3rd of August, 1915;

That he followed the law course of Laval University in Montreal for two years;

That in the month of July, 1917, he enlisted in the foreign legion of the French army and served from the date of his enlistment until the end of the hostilities;

That during the war he was wounded and decorated;

That the delay for his admission to the study of law was due to his absence at the front;

That it would be just that his clerkship should run from the date of his admission to the study of law in letters, namely: the 9th of July, 1915;

That he has obtained the approval of the General Council of the Bar for the passing of this act by the Legislature;

Whereas it is just to grant the petition of the said Jean Chauvin to have his clerkship dated the 9th of July, 1915, and to allow him to present himself at the next examination for admission to the practice of law;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Clerkship to date from July, 1915, etc.

1. In view of the military service of Jean Chauvin, his clerkship shall date from the 9th of July, 1915, and he shall be permitted to present himself at the examination for admission to the practice of law following the passing of this act.

When he may begin to practise.

The said Jean Chauvin may begin to practise his profession as an advocate immediately after passing the ordinary and regular examinations for admission to the practice of law.

Coming into force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
