

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Bar authorized to admit A. S. Cohen to practice.

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to permit Abraham Saul Cohen to practise law immediately after passing the required examination.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

C H A P. 161

An Act to authorize the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit Josaphat Frédéric Champagne to the practice of medicine and surgery, after examination

[Assented to, 4th of March, 1919]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Josaphat Frédéric Champagne, of the city and district of Montreal, has by his petition represented;

That in June, 1913, he was admitted as a student of medicine and surgery of Laval University, Montreal, and has attended the medical course of such university for the five years required;

That in 1918 the said university granted him a diploma of Doctor of Medicine;

That he did not obtain the permit to study medicine from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec, until 1917, having been prevented by unavoidable causes from obtaining it before entering the university;

That, owing to the foregoing, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec has consented to the passing of an act to authorize the petitioner to practise medicine, after undergoing the medical examinations required for a license, before the board of examiners of the said College;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed for an act to that effect, and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Josaphat Frédéric Champagne among its members, and to grant him the necessary license to practise medicine in the Province, after examination.

C H A P. 162

An Act to allow Joseph Cadieux to change his name to that
of Joseph Aumand Cadieux

[Assented to, 4th of March, 1919]

WHEREAS Joseph Cadieux, of the town of Montreal North, has by his petition set forth:

Preamble.

That he is the son of Adolphe Cadieux and Adeline Aumand, the latter deceased since several years;

That he received at his baptism the name of Joseph;

That from his youth till 1902, he lived at different places in the United States of America;

That, to avoid the drawback of having a name which was already borne by several persons in his family, he called himself Joseph Aumand Cadieux, and has, in fact, been known by that name;

That, on returning to this country, in 1902, he continued, save with rare exceptions, to call himself Joseph Aumand Cadieux;

That since then he has, both in his personal and private documents and in public deeds, in the various offices which he has filled, given and set down as his signature, either "J. A. Cadieux," or "Joseph A. Cadieux" or "Joseph Aumand Cadieux," and has carried on business under one of these three names;

Whereas the said Joseph Cadieux has by his petition set forth his desire to change his name to that of "Joseph Aumand Cadieux," with all the rights and obligations resulting therefrom;

Whereas the said Joseph Cadieux has also by his petition set forth his desire to have ratified for all purposes the certificates, diplomas, public deeds or private documents, contracts, agreements or covenants passed, made or entered into by or for him, till this day, under the name of J. A. Cadieux, Joseph A. Cadieux or Joseph Aumand Cadieux, and has prayed for the passing of an act for that purpose; and whereas it is expedient to grant his prayer;
