



# 8 GEORGE V

## CHAP. 1

An Act granting to His Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the Government for the financial years ending on the 30th June, 1918, and on the 30th June, 1919, and for other purposes connected with the public service

[Assented to 9th February, 1918]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

**W**HEREAS it appears, by messages from The Honour-<sup>Preamble.</sup>  
able Sir Pierre Evariste Leblanc, K. C. M. G.,  
Lieutenant-Governor of this Province, and the estimates  
accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mention-  
ed are required to defray certain expenses of the Govern-  
ment of the Province, not otherwise provided for, for the  
financial years ending on the 30th June, 1918, and on the  
30th June, 1919, and for other purposes connected with  
the public service; May it therefore please Your Majesty  
that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the King's  
Most Excellent Majesty, with the advice and consent  
of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative  
Assembly of Quebec, that:

**1.** From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of  
this Province, there shall and may be taken a sum, not  
exceeding in the whole six hundred and thirty-one thousand,  
five hundred and forty-two dollars and seventy-six cents,  
Amount that may be taken for year ending 30th June, 1918.

for defraying the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, for the financial year ending on the 30th June, 1918, as set forth in Schedule A annexed to this act.

Amount that may be taken for year ending 30th June, 1919.

**2.** From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of this Province, a sum, not exceeding in the whole five millions, nine hundred and sixty thousand, one hundred and eighty-four dollars and eighty-three cents, may be taken for defraying, during the financial year ending on the 30th June, 1919, the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, as set forth in Schedule B annexed to this act.

Payments subject to adjustment, &c.

**3.** Every payment or application of moneys, appropriated by this act, shall be held to be made provisionally, and subject to all adjustment in account hereafter, in respect of the Dominion and of the Province of Ontario, and of special funds which this act may in manner affect.

Accounts rendered to both Houses.

**4.** Accounts, in detail, of all moneys expended under the authority of this act, shall be laid before both Houses of the Legislature of the Province, in conformity with article 875 of the Revised Statutes, 1909.

Accounting to His Majesty.

**5.** The application of all sums expended under the authority of this act shall also be accounted for to His Majesty.

Coming into force.

**6.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
