

Examining
jury.

23. A jury, consisting of five members appointed by the Provincial Secretary, upon the recommendation of the corporation, assisted by the principal and by two professors of the school, designated by the principal, shall be appointed to examine the students who, on the completion of their studies, wish to obtain a diploma of competency.

24. The names of the students to whom diplomas are awarded shall be published in the *Quebec Official Gazette*, with the mention of the degree of merit obtained by each of them.

25. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 43

An Act respecting certain diplomas from the School of Commercial Studies of McGill University, Montreal

[Assented to 9th February, 1918]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Privileges
conferred by

diploma.

1. A diploma of licentiate in accountancy of McGill University, granted in the way hereinafter indicated, confers on its holder, notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the right to become a member of the Association of Accountants in Montreal, or of the Institute of Accountants and Auditors of the Province of Quebec, without passing the examinations generally required, and after payment of the usual fees and contributions.

Conditions
on which
diploma is
granted.

Before the diploma is granted, it must be demonstrated that the student is of the full age of twenty-one years, that he has followed the courses prescribed by the School of Commercial Studies of McGill University for three years, that he has attended as a clerk, during twelve months after leaving the school, the office of one of the members of the association or institute, or of any other accountant, and that he has successfully passed the final examination before a jury composed of the Director-Secretary and two professors of the above-mentioned School of Commercial Studies, a member of the association and a member of the institute.

Manner of

It shall be the duty of the association and of the institute

to nominate their delegates on the jury by a resolution ^{nomination} which must be transmitted to the Registrar of McGill ^{of delegates.} University as soon as the latter shall have given them notice, a month in advance, by registered mail, of the place, date and hour of the examination.

The consent of three of the members of the jury shall ^{Consent of} be necessary to pass the student. If, however, the as- ^{three mem-} sociation or the institute, or both, fail to nominate its or ^{bers} their delegates, the consent of two members of the jury ^{required to} shall suffice to pass the student. ^{pass.} ^{Proviso.}

The diploma of licentiate in accountancy granted by the ^{Signatures} school shall be signed by the Principal of McGill University, ^{to diploma.} and countersigned by three members of the jury, by the Provincial Secretary, as well as by the Registrar of the University.

CHAP. 44

An Act to amend the act to incorporate the school for higher commercial studies at Montreal

[Assented to 9th February, 1918]
