

C H A P. 130

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec
to admit William Montgomerie among its members,
after examination

[Assented to 22nd December, 1916]

WHEREAS William Montgomerie, of the town of Richmond, in the district of St. Francis, law student, has, by his petition, represented:

That he has passed all the examinations necessary for his admission as a law agent or solicitor in Scotland, having passed the examination in law in October, 1910, and that in consequence thereof he was entitled to be admitted as a law agent or solicitor to practise in all the courts of Scotland, Supreme as well as Inferior;

That at Edinburgh, on the 7th day of March, 1912, the Lords of Council and Session, sitting in judgment upon his petition, admitted him as a law agent or solicitor in Scotland, and appointed his name as to be enrolled as such;

That thereafter and until the month of August, 1914, he continued to practise his profession there;

That since the month of August, 1914, he has been resident of the town of Richmond aforesaid, and has been in the law office of Lawrence, Morris & McIver, at Richmond, and has since that time continued to follow the said work with the desire of becoming a member of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, and has continuously studied the laws of this Province, under the guidance and direction of Mr. William Morris, K. C. to whom he is indentured, under deed of indenture passed before P. C. Duboyce, N. P.;

That he is desirous of being admitted a member of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, after such examination as the board of examiners shall see fit to require;

That the council of the Bar of the district of St. Francis, at a meeting held at Sherbrooke on the 28th of September, 1916, unanimously adopted a resolution recommending the general council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec to approve of the petitioner's request and of this act;

That the general council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, at its general meeting held in the city of Quebec on the 26th of October, 1916, unanimously approved of the passing of an act authorizing the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit the petitioner among its members, after

such examination as the board of examiners shall see fit to require;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be passed for the above purpose, and it is expedient to grant the prayer to that effect contained in the said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is hereby authorized to admit the said William Montgomerie among its members, after such examination as the board of examiners shall see fit to require.

Coming into

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 131

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec, to admit Nathaniel William Jacobs to practise the profession of law, and to grant him his certificate therefor

[Assented to 22nd December, 1916]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Nathaniel William Jacobs, of the city of Montreal, has, by petition, represented:

That he has passed the examination for admission to study law, in Letters in July, 1913; in Science in January, 1915;

That he has followed a regular course of law at McGill University, Montreal, obtaining the degree of Bachelor of Civil Law in May, 1916;

That he also studied law, under notarial indenture, in the office of Lyon W. Jacobs, advocate, of the city of Montreal, for the full period of three years, since October, 1913;

That he passed the examination for admission to practise the profession of law, held at the city of Quebec, on the 3rd day of July, 1916;

That, according to law, the said Nathaniel William Jacobs will not be permitted to practise the profession of law until January, 1918;

That by such delay he suffers prejudice, the said delay being injurious to such petitioner's present, as well as future, interests;
