That owing to his studies, his qualifications and probation, the Board of Governors of the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec has consented to the passing of an act to authorize the said college to grant the petitioner a license to practise, as dentist, after the final examinations;

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer to that effect contained in said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Joseph Orphir Emile Brunet among its members, and to grant him the necessary license for the practice of dental surgery in the Province of Quebec, after final examination.

#### C H A P. 136

An Act to authorize the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit Tancrede Asselin among its members

[Assented to 22nd December, 1916]

**W**HEREAS Tancrede Asselin, of the city and district of Montreal, has by his petition represented:

That he is 30 years old;

That in the month of September, 1909, he was matriculated as a student of dental surgery at Laval University, in Montreal;

That he followed the course of lectures of that school for the four regulation university years;

That in September, 1909, he presented himself before the board of examiners of the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec, to pass the examination for

admission to study dental surgery, and passed for the "Sciences" part of the said examination;

That in April, 1913, he passed his university examinations and was awarded the degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery;

That later, in September, 1916, he presented himself again before the examiners of the said college, to complete the necessary examinations for admission to the study of dental surgery, and that he then passed the examination for the "Letters" part, and was regularly admitted to the study of dental surgery;

That owing to his studies and his qualifications and probation, the Board of Governors of the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec has consented to the passing of an act to authorize the said college to grant the petitioner a license to practise his profession after an examination on final subjects;

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer to that effect contained in the said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

## C H A P. 137

An Act to authorize the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec to admit Frederic William Saunders to the practice of dentistry

[Assented to 22nd December, 1916]

**Preamble.**

**W**HEREAS Frederic William Saunders, of the city and district of Montreal, doctor of dental science, has been duly admitted to follow and has followed a complete course and taken clinical training in dentistry in the school of dental surgery of McGill University, Montreal, from which, after due examination, he has graduated and received the diploma of doctor of dental science on the 12th of May, 1916;
