C H A P . 1 9

An Act to amend the Quebec Mining Act.

[Assented to 9th March, 1916]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the
Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly
of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 2106 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, as R.S., 2106,
amended by the act 1 George V (1st session), chapter 17, ^{am.}
section 6, is again amended:

a. By inserting therein, after the word: "lots", in the
second line of paragraph 2 thereof, the words: "but of not
less than half a lot, as the north half, the south half, the
east half or the west half, as the case may be,";

b. By inserting therein, after the word: "lots", in the
fifth line of the same paragraph, the words: "in the case of
lots of less than eighty acres".

R.S., 2121b, enacted. **2.** The Revised Statutes, 1909, are amended by inserting therein, after article 2121a, as enacted by the act 1 George V (2nd session), chapter 23, section 4, a new article 2121b, as follows:

Cancellation of faulty letters patent. **"2121b.** Whenever any letters patent are incomplete, or contain any clerical error or any wrong name, or an inexact description of the land to be conceded, the Minister, if no claim be made to the contrary, may order that the faulty letters patent be cancelled and that corrected letters patent be issued in their place.

Effect of issue of corrected letters patent. Such corrected letters patent must be returned on the same date as those that have been cancelled, and shall have the same effect as if they had been issued on the day of the date of issue of the cancelled letters patent."

R.S., 2129, replaced. **3.** Article 2192 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, is replaced by the following:

Penalty for commencing to mine without notice to Minister. **"2192.** Every person who commences to operate a mine or quarry, or who, after a suspension of six months, resumes operations already begun by himself or by others, is bound, under penalty of a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars, and costs, and, in default of payment, to imprisonment for not more than one month, to give to the Minister a notice in writing, setting forth:

- Contents of notice.
 1. The name and address of the person carrying on the operations;
 2. The locality and the description of the land on which such operations are carried on;
 3. The nature of the ore or mineral which is the object of the operations."

R.S., 2243a, replaced. **4.** Article 2243a of the Revised Statutes, 1909, as enacted by the act 1 George V (1st session), chapter 17, section 16, is replaced by the following:

Lt. Gov. in C. may fix price of mining concessions east of river Goynish. **"2243a.** For a period of two years, reckoned from the 9th of March, 1916, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, on account of the distance and the difficulties resulting from the short seasons, fix, for that part of the Gulf of St. Lawrence from the river Goynish towards the east, the price of mining concessions containing ferri-ferous sand, and have entered in the purchase price, for the past as well as for the future, the proportion already paid by the person acquiring the same as annual payment for a mining license upon the same land."

Coming into force. **5.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
