8. The road known as the "Montée de la Savane" shall be at the charge of and maintained: one-half by the town of St. Leonard de Port Maurice, that is to say, from and starting from the middle of the St. Michel road, and proceeding a distance of three arpents, four perches and five feet in the said "Montée"; and the other half by the municipality of the parish of St. Leonard de Port Maurice.

Costs.

9. The costs of this act shall be paid by the municipality of the parish of St. Leonard de Port Maurice.

Coming into
force.

10. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 71

An Act to amend the act 60 Victoria, chapter 72, respecting the parish of St. Michel Archange.

[Assented to 9th March, 1916]

Preamble.

WHEREAS, by their petition, *les Sœurs de la Charité de Québec*, a legal corporation having its principal place of business in the city of Quebec, have represented:

That by canonical decree dated 28th April, 1896, at the request of the said petitioners, the Administrator of the Roman Catholic archdiocese of Quebec erected as a parish under the name of "St. Michel Archange", the property belonging to the said petitioners, comprising lots Nos. 590 and 591 of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North, lot No. 737 and the southeast part of lot No. 746 of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, the said southeast part of lot No. 746 extending as far as the front road of the Petit Village, which bounds it on the northwest;

That by the act 60 Victoria, chapter 72, the Legislature of this Province confirmed the said canonical decree, and declared that, in future, the said territory should constitute a separate parish for civil purposes, under the name of "Parish of St. Michel Archange";

That since then the said petitioners have acquired the following property, contiguous to the said parish of St. Michel Archange, namely: 1.—in February 1908, lot No. 736 of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport; 2.—in 1900, the eastern part of lots Nos. 588 and 589 of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North, now comprising amongst others Nos. 589, 589-B and 589-C of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North; 3.—in January,

1913, lot No. 742 of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport;

That by the act 8 Edward VII, chapter 98, the said lot No. 591 of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North was impliedly detached from the said parish of St. Michel Archange, and now forms part of the city of Quebec;

That on the 3rd of November, 1913, by the canonical decree of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Quebec, the said two numbers 736 and 742 of the official cadastre of Beauport were annexed to the said parish of St. Michel Archange, and form part thereof for religious purposes;

That on the 19th of February, 1914, by the act 4 George V, chapter 72, the said numbers 589, 589-B and 589-C of the official cadastre of St. Roch North were detached from the city of Quebec and annexed to the said parish of St. Michel Archange;

That to ensure the proper working of the institutions under the direction of the said *Sœurs de la Charité* in the said parish of St. Michel Archange, namely, the hospital for the insane and hospital at Mastai for the inebriates, it is expedient that the said lots numbers 736 and 742 of the parish of Beauport be annexed for civil purposes to the parish of St. Michel Archange, as are already lots numbers 589, 589-B and 589-C of the parish of St. Roch North under the said act 4 George V, chapter 72, and that the boundaries of the said parish of St. Michel Archange be corrected accordingly;

Whereas, by the said petition, the said petitioners pray that an act be passed to annex to the parish of St. Michel Archange lots Nos. 736 and 742 of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, and consequently that the boundary of the said parish of St. Michel Archange be rectified for civil purposes;

And whereas it is expedient to grant the said prayer of the said petitioners;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Lots Nos. 736 and 742 of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, already canonically detached from the said parish of Beauport and annexed to the parish of St. Michel Archange in virtue of the said canonical decree of the 3rd November, 1913, are for the future, under the restrictions and conditions set forth in the said decree, reproduced as Schedule "A" of this act, annexed to the parish of St. Michel Archange for civil purposes.

Territory of parish of St. Michel Archange. **2.** The said parish of St. Michel Archange shall hereafter comprise the following lots, namely: lots Nos. 589, 589-B, 589-C and 590 of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North, lot No. 736, that part of lot No. 737 situate on the north of the Beauport Road, lot No. 742 and that part of lot 746 situate to the south of the *Petit Village* road, of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport.

Boundaries. Such territory, having an area of one hundred and seventy arpents and sixty-two perches, shall be bounded: on the northwest by the road of the *Petit Village* and lots Nos. 744, 743, 741, 739 and 735 of the official cadastre of Beauport; on the northeast by lots Nos. 733 and 731 of the same cadastre of Beauport; on the southeast by the Beauport Road called at that place "l'Avenue de la Canardière"; on the southwest by lots Nos. 585 and 589-A of the official cadastre of St. Roch North, and by lot No. 747 of the parish of Charlesbourg.

Coming into force. **3.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

SCHEDULE "A"

LOUIS NAZAIRE BEGIN, by the Grace of God and the Apostolic Church, *Archbishop of Quebec*.

We inform all persons to whom these presents shall come that, in view of the petition dated the third of November, nineteen hundred and thirteen, presented to us by "*les Révérendes Sœurs de la Charité*", for the purpose of obtaining that the territory owned by them, on one of which their Sanatorium of Villa Mastai is erected, and comprised within the limits of the parish of Saint Charles de Limoilou, the other contiguous, on the northwest side, to St. Michel Archange, and heretofore comprised in the parish of Notre-Dame de la Nativité de Beauport, be annexed to their property of the Asylum of St. Michel Archange, already erected into cure and parish of St. Michel Archange, on the 28th of April 1896, and for the purposes and reasons set forth in such decree;

1. Whereas it is expedient to fix the boundaries of the said parish of St. Michel Archange so that it shall contain within its limits the whole area of the property belonging to the *Sœurs de la Charité*, and intended for the asylum for insane, called the "St. Michel Archange Asylum";

2. Whereas the Villa Mastai sanatorium was founded in 1900, not for the purpose of commercial speculation, but

merely in accordance with our desire, and because the work carried on is entirely in conformity with the object of the existence of the *Sœurs de la Charité*, which is the relief of all moral sufferings; moreover, that the profits realized by such sanatorium are used for the care of orphans and aged persons without means, and consequently contribute to the support of the poor of the city of Quebec;

3. Whereas the administration of the said Mastai sanatorium depends upon that of the St. Michel Archange Asylum, which provides the said sanatorium with water, drainage, light, and even fire protection, and imposes upon the city of Quebec no expense, just as it receives no advantages therefrom;

4. Whereas the spiritual administration of the said Villa Mastai sanatorium is entrusted to several special chaplains residing at the Saint-Michel Archange asylum, and consequently, the said asylum in nowise benefits by the curial administration exercised in the said parish of Saint-Charles de Limoilou;

5. Whereas the establishment of the insane asylum, although subsidized by the Provincial Government, is, owing to circumstances beyond control, in a very disadvantageous financial condition, and requires from *Les Sœurs de la Charité* not only sacrifices as to devotedness, but also considerable pecuniary expenses which asylums of the same kind for the service of the public of the Province of Quebec have not to bear;

6. Whereas all such reasons which have decided us to erect St-Michel Archange asylum into a cure and parish seem to us to favor the annexation to the said parish of the entire property of Villa Mastai; and of the small territory contiguous thereto on the northwest side of the parish of St. Michel Archange;

Therefore we have annexed and do annex, by these presents, to the parish of St. Michel Archange the complete property of Villa Mastai and the two small lots contiguous on the northwest side to the said parish of Saint-Michel Archange and heretofore included in the parish of Notre Dame de la Nativité de Beauport;

Our decree, thus amended, fixes the limits of the said municipality of Saint-Michel Archange as follows, and it includes the following territory, namely:

1. The former parish of Saint-Michel Archange, namely: lots numbers seven hundred and thirty-seven (737), with the exception of part of the said lot which is the property of the Seminary of Quebec, and the southern part of lot number seven hundred and forty-six (746), of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, county of Quebec; the

numbers five hundred and ninety (590), five hundred and ninety one (591), with the exception of the part of the said lot number five hundred and ninety-one (591) belonging to the city of Quebec, of the official cadastre of the parish of Saint-Roch North, county of Quebec;

2. To be taken from this parish of Saint-Charles de Limoilou, the southern part of lot number five hundred and eighty-eight-B (588-B), five hundred and eighty eight-C (588-C), five hundred and eighty nine (589), five hundred and eighty nine-B (589-B) five hundred and eighty nine-C (589-C) of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North, county of Quebec.

3. To be taken from the parish of Notre-Dame de Beauport lots numbers seven hundred and thirty-six (736) and seven hundred and forty two (742), of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, county of Quebec.

The whole forming an area of three hundred and eighty-nine acres and eleven-hundredths, bounded as follows:

ON THE NORTH-WEST

By the northern part of lot number seven hundred and forty-six (746), by lots seven hundred and forty-five (745), seven hundred and forty-four (744), seven hundred and forty-three (743), seven hundred and forty-one (741), seven hundred and thirty-nine (739) and seven hundred and thirty-five (735), of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, county of Quebec.

ON THE NORTH-EAST

By the lots seven hundred and thirty-three (733), seven hundred and thirty-one (731), and part of lot seven hundred and thirty-seven (737), belonging to the Quebec Seminary, and by number fifty-eight (58), of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, county of Quebec.

ON THE SOUTH-EAST

By number five hundred and ninety-two (592), of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North, county of Quebec, by the line of low water mark of the River St. Lawrence.

ON THE SOUTH-WEST

By the numbers five hundred and ninety-one-A (591-A), five hundred and eighty-eight, (588), five hundred and eighty-eight-A (588-A), parts of lots five hundred and eighty-eight-B (588-B) and five hundred and ninety-one (591), belonging to the City of Quebec, by the numbers five hundred and eighty-five (585) and five hundred and eighty-nine-A (589-A) of the official cadastre of the parish of St. Roch North, county of Quebec; by the number seven hundred and forty-seven (747), of the official cadastre of the parish of Beauport, county of Quebec.

All such territory, as described on the official plan drawn up by Mr. L. Giroux, land-surveyor, and submitted to us with the said petition of November third, nineteen hundred and thirteen, shall in future form the parish of Saint-Michel Archange, for all matters concerning religious purposes and with all privileges connected therewith as regards the parishes of Notre-Dame de Beauport and Saint Charles de Limoilou.

It is further understood that the annexation of the said territories shall be subject to the conditions mentioned in our decree, dated April 28th, 1896, canonically erecting the said parish of Saint Michel Archange, and especially those which read as follows: (a) "The said cure is erected on condition, however, that if any portion of the territory should hereafter be sold or conceded to private individuals, the said parts of the territory shall duly re-enter under the jurisdiction of the neighboring parishes and under the control of the neighboring municipalities; (b) The community of *Les Sœurs de la Charité* shall continue to pay, until maturity, its share of the present assessment as homologated on June 10th, 1910, to pay the debt of the church of Notre Dame de Beauport; for the lots seven hundred and thirty-six (736) and seven hundred and forty-two (742) which formed part of the parish of Beauport to that date.

The said cure and parish of Saint-Michel Archange to be entirely under our jurisdiction or that of our successors, on the condition that the priests appointed by us or by our successors, whether as *curés* or chaplains or under any title whatsoever that the ecclesiastical authorities may be pleased to give them, shall exercise full parochial jurisdiction as defined by the laws of the Church, and, particularly, preach the word of God, administer the Sacraments, and keep registers of births and burials according to diocesan prescriptions.

Given at Quebec, under our signature, the seal of the Archdiocese and the counter-signature of our secretary, the third day of November, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

CHAP. 72

An Act to amend the charter of the Quebec Central Railway Company.

[Assented to 16th March, 1916]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Quebec Central Railway Company has, by its petition, represented:

That the construction of the line of railway known as the "Quebec Central Chaudiere Extension", authorized by the act 6 Edward VII, chapter 58, could not be completed within the delay specified, and it is necessary that such delay be extended;

Whereas the company has prayed that its charter be amended accordingly, and it is expedient to grant its prayer;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Powers continued and renewed.

1. All the powers and privileges granted by the act 6 Edward VII, chapter 58, are continued and renewed, inasmuch as need may be.

2. Section 10 of the act 6 Edward VII, chapter 58, is replaced as follows:

Commencement and completion of work.

"10. The works and constructions authorized by this act shall be commenced and completed as follows: the extension from Beauceville to the Famine River, a distance of about nine miles, shall be completed within two
