

Whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer contained in the said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Sale
authorized.

1. The above mentioned petitioners, namely, Joseph Gagnon, junior, the institute, and Joseph Gagnon, Donalda Gagnon, Deiska Gagnon, Emilia Gagnon, as well as Rose Gagnon, when the latter shall be of full age, or in the meantime her tutor and the curator to be appointed to the substitution, may sell, after previously obtaining the consent of the family council, duly homologated, the immoveable known under the official No. 368 of the parish of Sault-au-Recollet, by private sale and by mutual agreement; may receive the price thereof and give valid

quittance to the purchaser, provided the purchase price be invested in accordance with the provisions of article 953*a* of the Civil Code.

Discharge of
purchaser.

2. The purchaser shall not be bound to see to the re-investment of the amount of the purchase price from the moment the same has been invested by the institute in accordance with paragraphs 3 and 4 of the said article 953*a*, or deposited with the prothonotary in accordance with paragraph 5 of the same article.

Coming into
force.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 111

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to allow Joseph Philéas Philippe Caumartin to practise law.

[Assented to 9th March, 1916]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Joseph Philéas Philippe Caumartin of the city and district of Montreal, has, by his petition, represented:

That he was admitted to the study of law by the Bar of the Province of Quebec, at the examinations held on the 9th July, 1914;

That he studied until the month of July last under Mr. Lucien Denis, advocate, at Montreal, under a deed of indenture passed before Mr. J. M. Savignac, notary, on

the 9th September, 1914, and that since that date he has been attached to the office of Mr. René Chênevert, advocate, of the Montreal Bar;

That he has followed a complete course of legal studies at Laval University, Montreal, from which he obtained the diploma of Bachelor in Law;

That he passed the examinations for admission to the practice of law, held on the 6th of July last by the Bar of the Province of Quebec;

That he was unable to present himself for examination for admission to the study of law before the 9th of July, 1914;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, at its last meeting held at Three Rivers, approved the passing of an act to allow the petitioner to be admitted to the practice of law;

Whereas the said Joseph Phileas Philippe Caumartin has prayed for the passing of an act for the above purposes; and it is expedient to grant the prayer contained in the said petition;

Therefore His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit Joseph Phileas Philippe Caumartin to practise law immediately. Bar may admit J. J. P. Caumartin to practise.
2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.

C H A P . 1 1 2

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Solon Eliasoph amongst its members.

[Assented to 16th March, 1916]

WHEREAS Solon Eliasoph of the City of Montreal, Preamble. has, by his petition, represented:

That he entered the faculty of law of McGill University in October, 1911, and followed a regular course of law and passed the prescribed examinations, and in May, 1915, received his degree of Bachelor of Civil Law;

That he was indentured as a student of law for a period of three years from the first day of October, 1912;

That he passed the admission to study law examination
