

C H A P . 1 1 1

An Act to incorporate the municipality of Honfleur.

[Assented to 5th March, 1915]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Octave Guilmet, Anselme Beaudoin, François Beaudoin, Octave Marceau, and Alphonse Dion, all farmers, owners and residents of Notre Dame du Bon Conseil, in the canonical parish consisting of part of the parishes of St. Anselme and Ste. Claire, in the county of Dorchester, and St. Gervais and St. Lazare, in the county of Bellechasse, have, by their petition, represented that it is in the public interest that the territory hereinafter described, and consisting of parts of the parishes of St. Anselme and Ste. Claire, in the county of Dorchester, and of St. Gervais and St. Lazare, in the county of Bellechasse, be organized into a distinct municipality;

Whereas it is impossible for the petitioners to proceed under the Municipal Code, because such territory is situated in two counties;

Whereas it is expedient to grant such prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Incorporation of Honfleur.

1. The following territory is detached from the parishes of St. Anselme and Ste. Claire, in the county of Dorchester, and of St. Gervais and St. Lazare, in the county of Bellechasse, to constitute a distinct municipality under the name of "the municipality of Honfleur":

Territory.

a. In the parish of St. Anselme, county of Dorchester:

All the cadastral lots of the concessions of St. Luc, St. Jean and St. Octave, and part of the concession of St. Marc, comprising the Nos. 374 to 391 inclusive, of the cadastre of the said parish of St. Anselme;

b. In the parish of Ste. Claire, county of Dorchester:

The cadastral lots of the concession of Ste. Elisabeth from No. 1 to No. 16, inclusive, No. 18, and the lots from No. 20 to No. 37, inclusive;

c. In the parish of St. Gervais, county of Bellechasse:

In the second range, the cadastral lots from No. 429 to No. 439, inclusive, those of the "Petite Troisième" from No. 665 to No. 678, inclusive, and those of the third range from No. 639 to No. 664, inclusive;

d. In the parish of St. Lazare, county of Bellechasse:

The cadastral lots of the first range, from No. 132 to No. 153, inclusive, those of the first range or Grand Buckland

concession, from No. 10*h* to No. 3*g*, inclusive, and from No. 1144 to No. 1148, inclusive, of the said cadastre.

2. The inhabitants and ratepayers of such municipality shall constitute a corporation under the name of "the municipality of Honfleur", governed by the Municipal Code, ^{Constitution of municipality of Honfleur.} except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with this act.

3. The municipality of Honfleur shall form part of the ^{Part of county of Bellechasse.} county of Bellechasse for all purposes.

4. The first election of the municipality shall be held ^{First election.} on the thirtieth day after the sanction of this act, or, if such day be a non-juridical day, on the first following juridical day, and it shall be presided over by the secretary-treasurer of the municipality of St. Anselme, in the county of Dorchester, or, in his default, by a person appointed by the majority of the electors present at the meeting.

The subsequent elections shall take place at the date and ^{Subsequent elections.} in the manner prescribed by the Municipal Code.

5. This act shall come into force on the day of its ^{Coming into force.} sanction.

CHAP. 112

An Act to incorporate the municipality of Lac Tremblant Nord

[Assented to 5th March, 1915]

WHEREAS Henri N. Chauvin, advocate; Arthur Terroux, merchant; Rickson A. Outhet, landscape architect; Dr. L. de Lotbiniere Harwood; the Honorable Charles J. Doherty; William D. Lighthall, King's Counsel; Charles E. Racine, customs broker; William H. Wyman, manufacturer; Joseph Leblanc, manufacturer; R. A. Kirkpatrick, contractor; Thomas McLaren, architect; Charles A. Barnard, King's Counsel; Maurice Cullen, artist, and others, all of Montreal, and all having property on Lac Tremblant on that part contained in the township of Joly, have by their petition represented that it is expedient that a municipality be established for the northern part of Lac Tremblant (now part of the township of Joly) under the name of the "Municipality of Lac Tremblant Nord"; Preamble.
