

C H A P. 34

An Act to grant to the court of the district of Beauce concurrent jurisdiction over certain parishes of the county of Bellechasse.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Revised Statutes, 1909, are amended by inserting R. S. 3086^a therein, after article 3086 thereof, a new article, as follows; enacted.

“**3086a.** The court in the district of Beauce has concurrent jurisdiction with the court of the district of Quebec and the court of the district of Montmagny over the parishes of St. Camille and Ste. Sabine in the county of Bellechasse. Court of Beauce given certain concurrent jurisdiction with other courts.”

Such concurrent jurisdiction extends to all the officials of the court.”

2. The Revised Statutes, 1909, are amended by inserting R.S. 3100^a therein, after article 3100 thereof, a new article, as follows; enacted.

“**3100a.** The court in the district of Beauce has concurrent jurisdiction with the court of the district of Quebec and the court of the district of Montmagny over the parishes of St. Camille and Ste. Sabine in the county of Bellechasse. Court of Beauce given certain concurrent jurisdiction with other courts.”

Such concurrent jurisdiction extends to all the officials of the court.”

3. The cases and proceedings begun and pending at the time of the coming into force of this act, shall be continued, and the judgments to be rendered therein, as well as those already obtained, shall be executed as if the present act had not been passed. Pending cases.

4. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
