

Such regulations shall come into force only from the date of their publication in the *Quebec Official Gazette*.

Penalty of infringement.

“**3866e.** Every person, being the proprietor, lessee or manager of a hotel or boarding house, who refuses or neglects to comply with any of the provisions of this section or of any regulation enacted thereunder, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars and costs.

Certificate of inspector necessary to get license.

“**3866f.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, after the first of May, 1915, every revenue collector is forbidden to deliver a license to a proprietor, lessee or manager of a hotel or boarding house when such proprietor, lessee or manager is obliged to have such a license, without having obtained from such person a certificate from an inspector appointed under this section, stating that such hotel or boarding house is kept in accordance with the law and the regulations enacted in virtue thereof.”

Coming into force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

C H A P. 42

An Act relating to stationary engineers.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

3866m
enacted.

1. The Revised Statutes, 1909, are amended by inserting therein, after the sixth section of the second chapter of the seventh title thereof, as enacted by 4 George V, chapter 41, section 1, a new section and articles, as follows:

“SECTION VII

“*Stationary engineers.*”

Short title.

“**3866g.** This section may be cited as “The Quebec Stationary Engineers Act,” and, unless the context imply a different meaning, the following words, terms and expressions shall, for the purposes of this section, have the signification and meaning as follows:

Interpretative.

1. The words “Board of examiners” or “Examiners”, mean the examiners appointed under this section;

2. The words "installation of motive power" include all steam boilers and steam pipes, for producing motive power, for the heating of any establishment, or for producing steam in any establishment, of which the heating surface exceeds fifteen square feet;

3. The word "minister" means the minister of public works and labour;

4. The words "chief inspector" mean the chief inspector of industrial establishments and public buildings in the Province;

5. The words "stationary engineers" mean engineers in charge of an installation of motive power.

"**3866h.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may ^{Examiners to} appoint examiners, not more than three in number, with ^{be appointed.} such salaries as he may be pleased to fix.

Such salary or salaries and their travelling expenses shall be payable out of the consolidated revenue fund.

The examiners so appointed shall constitute the board of examiners. Such board shall be under the control of the minister.

"**3866i.** The special duties of the examiners shall be ^{Duties of} to hold examinations as to the efficiency of those who ^{examiners.} are or wish to become stationary engineers, and grant diplomas of efficiency.

"**3866j.** The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may ^{Regulations.} make regulations determining such special provisions as may be necessary for the proper working of the board, and particularly for the following purposes:

- a. To fix the method of examining candidates;
- b. To fix the tariff of fees to be paid, and a grading of diplomas;
- c. To enact any other provisions to facilitate the work of the examiners, and increase the efficiency of the service;
- d. To regulate the installation of motive power.

Such regulations shall come into force on the date of their publication in the *Quebec Official Gazette*, and may be altered from time to time, as necessity requires, and applied, wholly or in part, to certain industries, upon the order of the minister.

"**3866k.** Any person who infringes the provisions of any ^{Penalty for} regulation enacted under this section, shall be liable to ^{infringe-} a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, and costs, ^{ment.} and in default of payment thereof, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.

Annual report of examiners.

“3866l. The examiners shall make an annual report to the minister, and keep registers in which shall be entered the names of engineers who have passed the examinations, and also of the candidates and the amount of the fees collected. They shall preserve in their archives a copy of the answers of each candidate to the examination papers.

Examination programme to be approved. Boiler inspectors may be called.

“3866m. 1. The programme of examination shall be approved by the minister.

2. The chief inspector may call upon the services of the boiler inspectors whenever he deems necessary in the interests of the service.”

Coming into force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 43

An Act to amend the Quebec Public Health Act.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 3869 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, is amended by replacing the word “Nine” in the first line by the word “Ten”.

CHAP. 44

An Act to amend the Notarial Code.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

R.S. 4788 am.

1. Article 4788 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, is amended by inserting therein, after the word “years” in the second line thereof, the words: “and who has passed the regular examinations during such two years”.

2. Article 4819 of the said Statutes is amended by adding thereto the following paragraph:
