An Act respecting the dissolution of the Barbers' Association of the Province of Quebec.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

WHEREAS the Barbers' Association of the Province Preamble.
of Quebec, incorporated by the act 62 Victoria,
chapter 90, has not attained, and cannot, even in the
opinion of those who form part thereof, attain the object
for which it was incorporated;

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and
consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative
Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The act 62 Victoria, chapter 90, is repealed, and the
association thereby created is dissolved for all legal pur-
poses. 62 Vict. Ch. 90, repealed and association dissolved.

2. Any interested party or any creditor shall have, as
regards the property which belonged to the dissolved
association, the same recourse which he would have in
the case of a vacant succession and the property belonging
thereto, according to the provisions of articles 371 and
following of the Civil Code. Creditors rights to be as if against a vacant succession.

C H A P. 60

An Act to amend article 85 of the Civil Code relating to
election of domicile.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the
Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assem-
bly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 85 of the Civil Code, as replaced by the act
63 Victoria, chapter 38, section 1, is amended by adding
thereto, at the end thereof, a new paragraph, as follows: Art. 85 C. C. am.

“Save in the case of a notarial deed, an election of dom-
icile shall be without effect as regards the jurisdiction of
any court, when it is signed by a non-trader within the
boundaries of the district in which he resides.” Election of domicile without effect in certain cases.
