

and by-laws not contrary to law which it may deem essential and necessary for its interests and government; the present by-laws of the association in so far as they are consonant with the spirit of the act, shall remain in force unless or until so amended or repealed; shall have the power to make arrangements with any other similar societies, hospitals or corporations for the acquisition thereof or the amalgamation therewith under the name of the corporation hereby created, provided that such terms or conditions shall not change or modify in any respect the constitution of the corporation hereby created; and upon completion of such amalgamation the amalgamated societies, hospitals or corporations shall be governed by the provisions of this act.

Certain laws  
to apply.

**5.** Nothing in this act shall authorize the corporation to escape municipal laws, or by-laws, or the laws respecting health.

Statement to  
be made  
when re-  
quired.

**6.** The corporation shall transmit to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, when thereto required, a statement of the property it possesses, the names of its officers, and a copy of its rules and regulations.

Coming into  
force.

**7.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

## CHAP. 158

### An Act to incorporate the Rossland Jewish Synagogue.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS Isaac Malkevitch, coppersmith; Harry Zeltzer, cutter; Kievsky Tavaznansky, trader; Hyman Tabatchnikoff, carpenter contractor; Harry Weiss, tailor; Joseph Levinson, presser; Joseph Leiferman, grocer; Herzl Greenshpan, milkman, all of the city and district of Montreal, have by petition represented that they are persons professing the Jewish religion, and have prayed to be incorporated as a religious congregation for the purpose of divine worship in the city of Montreal, under the name of the "Rossland Jewish Synagogue;"

And whereas it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** Isaac Malkevitch, coppersmith; Harry Zeltzer, cutter; Corporation  
Kievy Tavaznansky, trader; Hyman Tabatchnikoff, car-constituted.

milkman, all of the city and district of Montreal, and all  
other persons who now are and may hereafter become  
members of the said congregation, are hereby constituted  
a corporation for the purposes of divine worship in the  
city of Montreal, under the name of the "Rossland Jewish Name.  
Synagogue."

**2.** All property, moveable and immoveable, now pos- Vesting of  
sessed by and held in trust for the congregation shall be property.  
and is transferred to and vested in the said corporation.

**3.** The said corporation may at all times acquire, sell, Powers.  
lease, exchange, transfer or otherwise alienate under  
any title whatsoever, in whole or in part, its moveable  
or immoveable property, hypothecate its immoveable  
property, or any part thereof, and acquire in its place and  
stead other moveable or immoveable property, and the  
said corporation shall have the power to make, draw, accept,  
endorse and transfer bills of exchange, promissory notes,  
cheques, bonds, and other negotiable documents and ins-  
truments under the signature of its officers and others in its  
corporate name as shall be determined by by-laws of the  
said corporation.

**4.** The said corporation may have, hold, possess and Additional  
erect, and may acquire by purchase, gift, will, or otherwise powers.  
any immoveable property in or near the city of Montreal  
that may be required for a synagogue or place of worship,  
or for a house for the residence of the rabbi or officiating  
minister, or for a cemetery or burying ground, or for  
any other purpose of the corporation; provided always  
that the use of any land for a cemetery shall be subject  
to the laws with respect to cemeteries; and provided fur- Proviso.  
ther that the immoveable property held by the said cor-  
poration shall not exceed on the whole the quantity of  
ten acres in superficial extent, and the annual value or  
revenue thereof shall not exceed the sum of twenty thou-  
sand dollars.

**5.** In the event of the said corporation receiving by Special  
gift, or will, an immoveable property in excess of that provision.  
which it is hereby authorized to possess, the said gift or  
legacy shall not on that account be void, but the said  
corporation shall be bound, within ten years from the

date of its entering into peaceable possession of the said gift or legacy, to sell and dispose of the immoveable property, or part of it, or some other of its immoveable property, in such manner that the immoveable property of the said corporation shall not exceed ten acres in superficies or in annual value the sum of twenty thousand dollars.

To keep registers of civil status.

**6.** The said corporation shall in the city of Montreal keep registers of acts of civil status in accordance with the laws of this Province, and may appoint from time to time a rabbi or officiating minister and may remove him and appoint another or others in his place, and the rabbi or officiating minister of the said congregation is hereby authorized and empowered to keep in the French or English language registers for acts of civil status, and to exercise all other powers appertaining to ministers of religious congregations.

By-laws.

**7.** The said corporation is authorized to make by-laws for its internal government and for the government and discipline of its members, to amend or repeal the said by-laws or any part of them as may be expedient, provided always that none of such by-laws be inconsistent with this act or with the laws of this province.

Laws applicable.

**8.** Nothing in this act shall have the effect of taking the corporation out of the control of the provisions of the charter and by-laws of the city of Montreal or of the other municipalities in which the said corporation intends to establish hospitals or convalescent cottage hospitals, or the provisions of the Quebec Public Health Act.

Statement to Lieut.-Gov. in Council.

**9.** The said corporation shall be obliged to furnish to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council a statement of its moveable and immoveable property and the names of its officers, whenever required so to do.

**10.** The act of the province of Lower Canada 9-10 George IV, chapter 75, shall not apply to the members and officiating minister of the said congregation.

Coming into force.

**11.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

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
