

1. Section 1 of the act 2 George V, chapter 125, is replaced by the following: 2 Geo. V, ch. 125, s. 1, replaced.

“**1.** The corporation of *Les Dames de l'Asile de Montréal pour les Orphelins Catholiques Romains* is authorized to sell the immovable above described and the building thereon erected with its dependencies, the price of sale to be not less than fifteen dollars per square foot. Sale of certain immovables authorized.

The purchaser of the said immovable shall have a clear and perfect title, and shall not be compelled to see to the investment of the price paid to the said corporation, notwithstanding all rights and claims of the legal representatives of the late Dame Josephite Cotté, the late Honourable Maurice Laframboise, and the late Mr. François Alfred Chartier Larocque, and the community of the Sisters of Charity of the General Hospital, of Montreal, called “the Grey Nuns”. Purchaser to have perfect title.

2. Section 2 of the said act 2 George V, chapter 125, is replaced by the following: Id., s. 2, replaced.

“**2.** The proceeds of such sale shall be used in purchasing another lot of land and in rebuilding the said asylum at such other place as the said corporation may deem advisable, and in maintaining it in accordance with its original destination and the charter of the corporation. Application of proceeds.

All the rights which third parties might claim to have in the said immovable, if any, shall be exercised exclusively, in future, on the land which shall be acquired by the said corporation out of the proceeds of the sale of the said immovable on St. Catherine street, but shall no longer be exercised against the latter immovable”. Rights of third parties, how exercised.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.

C H A P. 164

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Jean Charles Gaston Fontaine, to the study of the profession of advocate without examination.

[Assented to 19th February, 1914]

WHEREAS Jean Charles Gaston Fontaine, of the city of Hull, in the district of Ottawa, has by his petition represented:

That he is twenty years of age;

That he is a student in the office of E. B. Devlin, Esq., K. C., of the city of Hull;

That he followed a course of classical studies in the University of Ottawa during four years, and afterwards studied under private tuition;

That he is afflicted with a very serious malady, which has prevented him from continuing his classical studies, and his present physical condition is such that he cannot and will not be able to re-enter a classical college, or resume his classical studies;

That he is anxious to begin the study of the profession of advocate, but is unable to do so, owing to his delicate condition, unless admitted thereto by act of the Legislature without preliminary examination;

That he is prepared to fulfill all the requirements of the Bar for admission to the study of the profession of advocate, except the preliminary examination which his present physical condition prevents him from passing;

That, at a meeting of the Bar of the district of Ottawa, held at Hull, on the 25th day of September, 1913, at which were present the majority of the members of the said Bar, a resolution was unanimously adopted recommending that the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec approve of the prayer of the petitioner, and of this act;

That the general council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, at its general meeting held at the city of Montreal on the 29th day of October 1913, unanimously approved of the passing of an act allowing him to be admitted to the study of the profession of advocate, without preliminary examination;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be passed for the above purposes; and it is expedient to grant the prayer to that effect contained in the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Admission of J. C. G. Fontaine to the study of law authorized.

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit the said Jean Charles Gaston Fontaine to the study of the profession of advocate without the necessity of passing the preliminary examination thereto, and the secretary-treasurer of the General Council of the Bar is authorized to issue to him a certificate as such student.

Coming into force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
