

## C H A P . 4 6

An Act to amend the Code of Civil Procedure respecting the taking of oaths in the county of Saguenay.

[Assented to 3rd April, 1912.]

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** Article 29 of the Code of Civil Procedure, as amended by C.C.P., 29, the act 4 Edward VII, chapter 46, section 1, is further amended by adding the following paragraph:

“Every priest, rector, missionary, minister or other officer authorized to keep registers of civil status in the county of Saguenay, is also authorized to administer the same oath as a commissioner of the Superior Court.”

Certain priests, &c., authorized to administer oaths.

## C H A P . 4 7

An Act to amend the Code of Civil Procedure respecting commissions for examination of witnesses.

[Assented to 3rd April, 1912.]

**HIS MAJESTY**, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

**1.** The following article is inserted in the Code of Civil Procedure after article 385:

C.C.P., 385a, added.

“**385a.** The judge may also, if he thinks just, in exceptional cases, not restrict the commissioners to the interrogatories and cross-interrogatories mentioned in article 385, and may permit them to put or to allow to be put by the parties all questions which they think relevant to the case.”

Open commissions.

**2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
