

C H A P . 4 9

An Act to amend the Code of Civil Procedure respecting execution against moveable and immoveable property.

[Assented to 3rd April, 1912.]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Article 638 of the Code of Civil Procedure is amended C.C.P., by adding at the end of the second paragraph the words: ^{638, am.} "and a duplicate of the notice shall be transmitted without delay and without costs, by means of a registered letter to the sheriff's office. The failure to transmit a duplicate of such notice shall not render the proceedings invalid but the officer in default shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom."

2. Article 639 of the Code of Civil Procedure, as amend-Id., 639, am. ed by the acts 6 Edward VII, chapter 42, section 2, and 1 George V (1st session), chapter 44, section 1, is further amended by striking out the word "summarily" in the second and third lines.

3. The following paragraph is inserted in the Code of Id., 639, am. Civil Procedure at the end of article 639 as amended by the acts 6 Edward VII, chapter 42, section 2, and 1 George V (1st session), chapter 44, section 1:

"The sheriff shall keep in his office a register in which he Sheriff's shall enter the certificates of publication and notices of sale of register. moveable property, giving to each the number corresponding to the order of entry."

4. The following article is inserted in the Code of Civil Id., 719b, Procedure after article 719a as enacted by the act 61 Vic-added. toria, chapter 47, section 4.

"**719b.** The sheriff shall keep in his office a register in which Sheriff's he shall insert the notices of the sale of immoveables or register. rents, as the case may be, giving to each the number corresponding to the order of entry."

5. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
