An Act relating to the "Laprairie Brick Company, Limited."

[Assented to 3rd April, 1912.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Laprairie Brick Company, Limited, has, by its petition, represented:

That it is carrying on a brick manufacturing business in the town and parish of Laprairie, and in order to successfully and economically carry on and develop its operations, it is necessary that it should be empowered to construct, build, operate and maintain a railway and branches;

That, to successfully and economically carry on and develop its operations, it was necessary for the company to acquire land in the Common of Laprairie de la Magdeleine, and that it is necessary that it should acquire more land in the Common of Laprairie de la Magdeleine;

That it has, by deed passed before Larose, Notary, on the 14th day of March, 1911, and bearing number 5,537 of the minutes of the said notary, acquired from the president and trustees of the Common of Laprairie de la Magdeleine a piece of land therein described;

That it is necessary and in the interest of the company and of the president and trustees of the Common of Laprairie and of the public generally that the deed aforesaid be ratified and confirmed, and it is expedient to grant such petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Company authorized to build railways, etc.

1. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 6 of article 6474 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, the company is vested with all necessary powers for constructing, building, maintaining and operating a railway, or tramway, with steam, electricity, or any other motive power, for the conveyance of freight, running from a point situated on the north bank of the river St. Lawrence, on or near the Common of Laprairie de la Magdeleine, and thence running in a south-westerly direction on the Common of Laprairie to the main line of the Grand Trunk Railway of Canada, known under the name of the "line running to St. John, P. Q.," in the county of Laprairie, and such branches necessary to unite the principal line of the company with the other railroads going through the county of Laprairie.

Building of bridges.

2. The company may erect the bridges required for its railway and branches over rivers and streams at such places as may be suitable.

3. The company may acquire, lease, hold, develop and operate water-powers on the Island of Montreal and in the county of Laprairie. Acquiring, &c., of water-powers.

4. The company is authorized to enter into arrangements with any other railway company for the purpose of leasing, selling or transferring its railway, wholly or partly, or any interest if may have therein, or with any other company of the same kind, on such conditions, as the company may deem suitable, subject to the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council. Arrange-ments with other rail-way com-panies.

5. The company shall be governed by the Railway Act (Articles 6467 and following of the Revised Statutes, 1909,) in so far as the same is not derogated from by this act. Law to apply.

6. Article 6644 of the Revised Statutes, 1909, shall not apply to the company. R.S.Q., 6644, not to apply.

7. The deed of sale passed on the 14th day of March, 1911, between the president and trustees of the Common of Laprairie de la Magdeleine and the Laprairie Brick Company, Limited, before Larose, notary, bearing No. 5537 of his minutes, is ratified and confirmed and declared valid and binding upon the parties to this deed and also upon all interested parties in the Common of Laprairie de la Magdeleine, other than the company of Jesus; but such sale shall not take effect until approved by the Company of Jesus, provided the right herein conferred shall not hereafter be interpreted as granting or acknowledging over the remainder of the said Common any right other than those at present existing under the law or the title respecting the matter. Certain deed of sale ratified.

8. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
