

Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the deed of acquisition ^{Sale of cer-} allowing the corporation to sell, and for the purpose of dispelling ^{tain immove-} all doubt on the subject, the corporation of *Les Dames de* ^{ables author-} *l'Asile de Montréal pour les Orphelins Catholiques Romains* is authorized to sell the immoveable above described and the building thereon erected with its dependencies, the price of sale to be not less than fifteen dollars per square foot.

2. The proceeds of such sale shall be used in purchasing ^{Application} another lot of land and in rebuilding the said asylum at such ^{of proceeds.} other place as the said corporation may deem advisable, and in maintaining it in accordance with its original destination and the charter of the corporation.

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. ^{Coming into} ^{force.}

CHAP. 126

An Act to incorporate *La Société de Marie Réparatrice*.

[Assented to 14th March, 1912.]

WHEREAS *Les Religieuses de Marie Réparatrice*, men- ^{Preamble.} tioned below and established in Montreal with the approval of His Grace the Archbishop of Montreal, have by their petition prayed to be incorporated for pious and charitable purposes, and whereas it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The community of *La Société de Marie Réparatrice* ^{Persons in-} shall be a corporation consisting of Madeleine Michel de ^{corporated.} Villebois, in religion, Mother Marie de Ste. Elizabeth de France, ^{Name.} Superioress; Aline Planchenault, in religion, Mother Marie du Bienheureux Gonzalès; Marguerite de Touchebœuf-Clermont, in religion Mother Marie de Ste. Domitilla, and Maud Cameron, in religion Mother Marie of Stella Maris, all domiciled in Montreal, and also other persons now constituting or who may constitute such community in accordance with its rules, statutes and by-laws.

It shall, under the above name, have perpetual succession. ^{Perpetual}

succession.
Powers.

It may have a common seal which it may change at will, appear before the courts, hold, accept and acquire by any legal title, moveable and immoveable property which it may alienate, transfer and hypothecate and may otherwise enjoy and dispose of the same under any title, like any other person.

Limit of
revenues.

The annual revenue from the immoveables held by the community in this Province for purposes of revenue, shall not exceed five thousand dollars.

Establish-
ments of
community.

2. The community may have establishments for pious and charitable works.

Government
of commu-
nity, &c.

3. The community shall be governed by its statutes and may make by-laws for the administration of its property, its internal government, the election, numbers and powers of its officers, directresses and councillors, the admission and discharge of its members and generally all by-laws for the purposes of the corporation.

Corporate
seat.

4. The corporate seat of the corporation shall be in the city of Montreal.

Change of
same.

Another place in this Province may at any time be chosen for such seat, by a by-law of the corporation.

5. The signature of the superioress of the community in this Province or of the bursar of its principal establishment, also in this Province, shall at all times suffice for legal matters and shall bind the corporation without further formality.

6. The corporation shall transmit to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, when required so to do by the Provincial Secretary, a statement of its moveable and immoveable property, the names of its officers, and a certified copy of its by-laws.

Coming into

7. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 127

An Act to amend the charter of the St. James' Club of Montreal and amendments thereto.
