## CHAP. 1

An Act granting to His Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the Government for the financial years ending on the 30th June, 1911, and the 30th June, 1912, and for other purposes connected with the public service.

[Assented to 24th March, 1911.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

**W**HEREAS it appears, by messages from the Honourable Preamble.

Sir Louis Amable Jetté, K.C.M.G., Administrator of this Province, and the estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Government of the Province, not otherwise provided for, for the financial years ending on the 30th June, 1911, and the 30th June, 1912, and for other purposes connected with the public service ; May it therefore, please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, that :

1. From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of this Province, a sum, not exceeding in the whole ninety-five thousand two hundred and seventy-six dollars and fifty-five cents, may be taken for defraying, during the financial year ending on the 30th June, 1911, the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, as set forth in the Schedule A annexed to this act. Amount that may be taken for year ending 30th June, 1911.

**2.** From and out of the consolidated revenue fund of the Province, a sum, not exceeding in the whole three millions, nine hundred and twenty-eight thousand, five hundred and fifty dollars and fifteen cents, may be taken for defraying, during the financial year ending on the 30th June, 1912, the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, as set forth in the Schedule B annexed to this act.

**3.** Every payment or application of moneys, appropriated by this act, shall be held to be made provisionally, and subject to all adjustment in account hereafter, in respect of the Dominion and of the Province of Ontario, and of special funds which this act may in any manner affect.

**4.** Accounts, in detail, of all moneys expended under the authority of this act, shall be laid before both Houses of the Legislature of the Province, at the next session thereof.

**5.** The application of all sums expended under the authority of this act shall also be accounted for to His Majesty.

**6.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
