

C H A P . 1 3 8

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to permit George Bélanger to practise law.

[Assented to 14th March, 1911]

Preamble.

WHEREAS, George Bélanger has, by his petition, represented :

That he followed a complete course of classical study in the minor Seminary of Quebec, where he obtained a diploma of Bachelor of Arts ;

That he followed a complete course of legal studies at Laval University, Quebec, and at McGill University, Montreal, where he obtained a diploma of Bachelor of Civil Laws on the 6th May, 1910 ;

That, after having been admitted to the study of law by the Board of Notaries on the 17th July, 1903, he attended the office of a notary as a student for three years, as attested by the certificate of his patron, Mr. Ernest Labrecque, notary, of Quebec ;

That on the 14th January, 1909, he was admitted to the study of law by the Bar of the Province of Quebec ;

That he successfully passed the examination for admission to practice on the 5th July, 1910 ;

That on the 22nd of March 1910, he was indentured to an advocate and regularly attended his office until this day, as appears by the certificate of his patron ;

That, through his studies and experience, he possesses all the knowledge and qualities required for the practice of the legal profession, as attested by the certificate of his patron ;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec unanimously approved of the passing of an act allowing him to practise immediately without completing his three years of studentship ;

Whereas the said George Bélanger has prayed that an act be passed for the above purposes, and it is expedient to grant the prayer to that effect contained in the said petition ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to permit George Bélanger to practise the legal profession at once.
