

CHAP. 118

An Act to authorize the Bar of the Province of Quebec to admit Bernard Rose among its members after examination

[Assented to 4th June, 1910]

Preamble.

WHEREAS, Bernard Rose, of the city and district of Montreal, has, by his petition represented :

That he is twenty-nine years of age ;

That he was born in London, England, where he received a rudimentary education ;

That since the 2nd April, 1901, he is a Master of Philosophy of the Anglo-American University of the city of Chicago, in the State of Illinois, one of the United States of America ;

That owing to circumstances beyond his control he was prevented from passing his examination for admission to the study of law in the Province of Quebec ;

That, during the past five years, he has assiduously attended the office of Mr. M. J. Morrison, advocate, of the city of Montreal ;

That, since the month of September 1907, he has regularly followed the lectures of the faculty of law at Laval University, in Montreal ; that he has so far satisfactorily passed the examinations required by the regulations and intends to present himself in June, 1910, when the course of lectures is ended, for examination for license ;

That he wishes to be admitted among the members of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, after passing the examination for admission to practice ;

That the General Council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec has approved the petitioner's application to present a bill to allow him to pass the examination to practice law, upon his obtaining from Laval University the degree required by law.

Therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is hereby authorized to admit the said Bernard Rose, among its members, after examination ; provided, however, that the said Bernard Rose shall have previously obtained the degree from Laval University which the law requires.

Coming into

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
