

CHAP. 18

An Act to amend article 25 of the Quebec License Law

[Assented to 27th April, 1909]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Article 25 of the act 63 Victoria, chapter 12, as amended by the acts 1 Edward VII, chapter 11, section 1 ; 2 Edward VII, chapter 13, s. 4 ; 5 Edward VII, chapter 13, sections 6 to 11, both inclusive, and 8 Edward VII, chapter 19, section 5, is further amended by replacing all the words after the word "them", in the fifth line of paragraph 1 by the following : "and at the Police Court in Montreal, for the city of Montreal, by three persons chosen by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council among the judges of the Sessions of the Peace in office and receiving emoluments as such, the police magistrates and the recorders of the city of Montreal, or two of such persons."

CHAP. 19

An Act to amend the Revised Statutes respecting the closing of taverns

[Assented to 29th May, 1909]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Article 1107 of the Revised Statutes is replaced by the following :

tain hours,
forbidden.

"**1107.** Every person licensed to sell, and whosoever sells by retail, in quantities less than one pint, imperial measure, in any city, town or village whatsoever, intoxicating liquors, wine, beer, or temperance liquors, shall close the house or building in which such person sells or causes to be sold, or allows such liquors to be sold, on any and every day of the week from midnight until five o'clock in the morning, and during the whole of each and every Sunday in the year.

Whosoever is found guilty of any infraction of this article

shall be liable to pay a fine of not less than thirty dollars and Penalties. not more than seventy-five dollars and costs, and, in default of the payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than three months in the common gaol of the district in which the said infringement has occurred."

2. Article 1108 of the said statutes is replaced by the following : Id., 1108,
replaced.

" **1108.** Any municipal corporation shall have the right to Courts before prosecute any persons, partnerships or corporate bodies infringing any of the provisions of article 1107, before the Circuit Court, the recorder's court, or police court, or before any two justices of the peace, within the limits of the district in which the offence or infringement shall have been committed." which prose-

C H A P . 20

An act to amend the Revised Statutes respecting stamps upon
registration and judicial proceedings

[Assented to 7th May, 1909]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Article 1181 of the Revised Statutes is amended by R.S.Q., 1181, inserting before the last paragraph thereof the following para-
graph : amended.

"The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may, from time to L. G. in C. time, make, amend and repeal any tariff or tariffs of fees for such registration or searches, in substitution for the tariff contained in this article." may make
