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## C H A P . 56

An Act to amend the act respecting the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec

[As entered to 29th May, 1909]

**H**IS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Article 4055 of the Revised Statutes, as replaced by the R.S.Q., 4055, act 52 Victoria, chapter 40, section 1, and amended by the amended. acts 55-56 Victoria, chapter 32, section 1 ; 57 Victoria, chapter 37, section 1 ; 59 Victoria, chapter 30, section 1 ; 62 Victoria, chapter 36, section 1 ; 4 Edward VII, chapter 28, section 2 and 8 Edward VII, chapter 60, section 1, is again amended :

a. By replacing paragraph 2 by the following :

“ 2. The Board shall consist of eleven qualified members of Composition the College elected at a general meeting held for this purpose. of Board.  
At least one of such members shall be domiciled in the district of Quebec, another in the district of Saint Francis, Arthabaska and Bedford, and nine in any part of the Province.

b. By replacing paragraph 3 by the following :

“ 3. The election of the eleven members of the Board of Election of Governors eligible by the members of the College, shall be held Governors.  
as follows :

During the last ten days of the month of September of each Reception of year, the secretary of the Board shall receive the nominations nominations by secretary. of all the members of the College qualified to be elected to the office of governor provided they are in writing and signed by two members of the College qualified to vote at such election.

Nevertheless, no nomination-paper so signed and sent shall Nomination paper to contain eleven nominations, there must be at least one of a member of the nominations, College domiciled in the district of Quebec and another of &c.

a member domiciled in one of the districts of St. Francis, Arthabaska or Bedford, and no member of the College shall have the right to so nominate more than eleven candidates for each election. Should this rule be infringed, the secretary of the Board shall, without delay, submit such nomination-papers to the Board which may set aside all the nomination-papers signed by such member or members.

Notification to nominees to accept or refuse nomination.

At the expiration of the ten days during which the members of the College have the right to so nominate candidates for the office of member of the board of Governors, the secretary shall, during the five following days, notify by registered letter each member of the College duly nominated, to inform him, within the same delay and in the same manner of his acceptance or refusal of the nomination.

No reply means refusal.

Failure to reply within such delay shall be equivalent to a refusal of such nomination.

Printing, &c, of nomination-paper if more nominated than there are vacancies.

If, after such delay, more candidates are nominated than there are offices to fill, the secretary shall, within the five following days, have a nomination-paper printed, according to schedule A, and shall send a copy thereof by registered letter to each member of the College, and each of such members may give his vote for eleven candidates on the said nomination-paper, by marking a cross opposite the name of each of the eleven candidates for whom he wishes to vote ; provided, however, that out of such eleven votes at least one shall be given for a candidate domiciled in the district of Quebec and another for a candidate domiciled in one of the districts of St. Francis, Arthabaska or Bedford. Every such nomination-paper shall be folded by the voter in such manner that only the signature of the voter on the counterfoil of the nomination-paper and the seal of the College on the nomination-paper itself shall be seen, and shall be sent back to the secretary by registered-letter not later than the Saturday preceding the date of the general meeting held for the election.

How voting to take place, &c.

Appointment of scrutineers counting of envelopes, &c.

On the day of the said meeting, after the matters that have to be dealt with are submitted and settled, the members of the College present who are entitled to take part therein, shall elect four of their number as scrutineers for the election. The scrutineers, after receiving from the secretary the envelopes containing the nomination-papers, shall count the latter, detach from each nomination-paper the counterfoil bearing the voter's signature and, without opening it, deposit the nomination-paper in a ballot box.

Rejection of certain votes.

In thus counting the nomination-papers, they shall put aside those of members who have no right to vote at the meeting without, however, opening them.

They shall then make a list of the names of the persons whose votes have been accepted by them and of those whose

votes have thus been temporarily put aside and shall post up the list in the meeting-room. have voted, &c

Any member of the College whose nomination-paper has thus been put aside may during the meeting pay his contributions to the treasurer or his representative and, if not otherwise prevented from voting, he may take back his paper and deposit it himself in the ballot-box. Payment of contributions and voting during meeting

The members of the College who have not voted in the manner above set forth may obtain a nomination-paper from the scrutineers and vote at such meeting if qualified to do so. Voting of certain members.

After the chairman of the meeting has ascertained that all the members present have voted or have had an opportunity of doing so, the scrutineers shall open the nomination papers and count the votes, rejecting all papers having more than eleven votes or otherwise improperly marked ; they shall likewise reject all the papers of members who have not paid their contributions and which they put aside at the beginning of the voting, and shall report to the chairman of the Board of Governors going out of office who shall inform the meeting of the result of the voting and proclaim the members elected. Counting of votes, &c.

If during the last ten days of September of each year, no more persons are nominated than there are offices to be filled, the chairman going out of office shall, on the day of the meeting for the election, inform it thereof and proclaim elected the persons so nominated. Election if nominees do not exceed vacancies.

No member of the College who has accepted nomination can withdraw his candidacy. Nomination not to be withdrawn.

If a member of the College has inadvertently marked, spoiled or torn the paper given him in such manner that he cannot make proper use of the same, he may return it to the secretary and request him to send another" ; Procedure if nomination-paper spoiled

f. By replacing paragraph 8 by the following :

" 8. The meeting for the election of the members of the Board shall be held annually on the fourth Monday of October or on the following juridical day if it be a non-juridical day. Date of election of Governors.

If there are not at least twenty-five qualified members of the College present, nothing shall be done at such meeting beyond the election of the members of the Board. In certain case Board to be elected only.

In such case, the secretary shall call another meeting by thirty days notice in the *Quebec Official Gazette*, stating the place, date and hour of such meeting ; Notice of other meeting.

g. By adding the following after paragraph 8 :

" 8a. The quorum of all meeting of the members of the College shall be twenty-five." Quorum at meetings of College.

Acts derogatory to professional honour.

“ 8b. The following above are declared to be derogatory to professional honour:

1. Acceptance by a member of the Board of Governors of money or any other advantage or the promise of money or of any other advantage for contributing or having contributed to the taking of any proceeding or the rendering of any decision whatever by the Board of Governors of the Dental College ;

2. Divulging a professional secret ;

3. Sharing between dentists and those who are not dentists of profits arising from the practice of dentistry ;

4. Associating or consulting with quacks ;

5. The habitual abuse of alcoholic liquors or of narcotics ;

6. Publishing advertisements in which are mentioned the prices for different kinds of professional services ; publishing cases of healing or treatment ; distributing circulars mentioning things prohibited by the present section ; advertising by signs elsewhere than at a dentist's office ; calling public attention to special modes of work with intent to deceive the public ; claiming by any advertisement superiority over brother dentists ; advertising free operations ; soliciting patients from house to house ; advertising nostrums ;

7. The allowing by a practising dentist of a person who is not a licentiate, to practice the said profession in his name or under his patronage, or under any style whatever in his office ; the allowing a student or licentiate who has been forbidden to practice for violation of the law or of by-laws, to practice directly or indirectly, or, by placing his name in conjunction with that of a practicing dentist upon a sign or otherwise, to represent himself as the partner of such practising dentist or as being connected with his office ;

8. An agreement between a practising dentist and a candidate who has been rejected at the final examination, for the purpose of enabling such candidate to unlawfully practice the said profession or to evade the law respecting the practice of dentistry in the Province.

9. A practising dentist allowing a licentiate forbidden to practice his profession, to practice under his name or patronage, or in his office, or under any name or style whatever, or making arrangements with him to enable him to unlawfully practice such profession.

10. A dentist advertising through any business firm or allowing such firm to advertise for him ; advertising under any firm or corporate name whether by signs or advertisement in newspapers, magazines or otherwise, anything declared by this act to be derogatory to the honour of the profession.

Sub-paragraphs 7, 8, and 9 of this paragraph shall not be cons-

trued as affecting paragraphs 8, 9, 10, and 11 of article 4065 of the Revised Statutes.

*h.* By adding the following to paragraph 9 :

“ Provided however, that such regulations be not inconsistent with the laws of this Province or of Canada. Id., par. 9, amended.

*i.* By replacing paragraph 11 by the following :

“ 11. The examinations for university degrees in dental surgery shall be held in the presence of one or more assessors, members of the Board of Governors, or licensed to practice dental surgery, appointed for that purpose by the said Board. Assessors at university examinations.

The assessor or assessors for the examinations held in the city of Quebec shall be chosen from among dentists practising in the said city.” From whom Quebec assessors chosen.

**2.** Article 4055*b* of the said statutes as enacted by the act 59 Victoria, chapter 30, section 3 and amended by the acts 62 Victoria, chapter 36, section 4 and 4 Edward VII, chapter 28, section 4, is replaced by the following :

“ **4055*b*.** Any person may, however, receive from the College, without any further examination as to his dental knowledge or skill, a license to practise dentistry in this Province and the title of licentiate of dental surgery, upon fulfilment of the following requirements : License without further examination.

1. He must have obtained at least the degree of Master of Dental Surgery from any school or university mentioned in article 4055 to which the Board of Governors has appointed one or more assessors, provided that such degree is obtained only after following a course of dentistry of four yearly sessions in one of the said universities, counting from the date of his having passed the examination required by the Board of Governors of the College, of candidates for admission to the study of dentistry and according to the curriculum of study prescribed by the said Board of Governors ; Obtaining of certain degree, &c.

2. He must, at least one month before the regular meeting of the said Board held in April as prescribed by article 4059, have paid to the treasurer of the said College the fee required from candidates to be admitted to practise dentistry and sent the receipt therefor to the secretary of the said College, together with a certificate attesting, to the satisfaction of the said Board, his integrity and good character.” Payment of certain fee, &c.

**3.** Article 4058 of the said Statutes, as replaced by the act 55-56 Victoria, chapter 32, section 3, and amended by the acts 57 Victoria, chapter 37, section 2 ; 62 Victoria, chapter 36, section 5, and 4 Edward VII, chapter 28, section 5, is further amended :

a. By replacing paragraph 2 by the following :

" 2. The candidate may then enter into a notarial agree-  
ment with a licensed dentist of this Province actually prac-  
tising as such in a regularly established office, and shall deliver  
a copy of the said indenture to the secretary of the Board,  
which indenture the secretary shall then register.

actually employed in the study and practise of dentistry.

The candidate may, if he prefers, not enter into a notarial

and clinics prescribed by the university schools recognized by  
the Board during four yearly sessions of the said schools."

" 3. The said time of study, including the necessary courses  
of lectures and clinics established by the Board, shall be the  
same as for those who are not under indenture."

57 Victoria, chapter 37, section 3 ; 62 Victoria, chapter 36,  
section 7 ; and 4 Edward VII, chapter 28, section 6, is further  
amended :

a. By replacing paragraph 1 by the following :

Dates of

" 1. The examinations for admission to study shall be held  
twice a year on the first Wednesday of April and the second  
Wednesday of September, and for admission to practice on the  
first Wednesday of April of each year. Nevertheless, supple-  
mentary examinations for admission to practice may be held  
on the second Wednesday of September of each year, notwith-  
standing any by-law of the College now in force " ;

b. By replacing paragraph 4 by the following :

Quorum of  
Governors,  
&c.

" 4. Six members of the Board of Governors shall be a  
quorum."

**5.** Article 4061a of the said statutes, as enacted by the  
act 59 Victoria, chapter 30, section 3, and replaced by the act  
4 Edward VII, chapter 28, section 7, is amended by replacing  
the word " two ", in the first line, by the word : " one ".

**6.** Article 4062 of the said statutes as amended by the  
act 62 Victoria, chapter 36, section 8, is further amended  
by replacing paragraph 26 thereof by the following :

" 26. Any party aggrieved by the final decision rendered  
by the Board may appeal to a general meeting of the mem-  
bers of the College or to the courts.

Coming into

**7.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
