8. The corporation shall, at the request of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, send a report of its operations, with a statement of the immoveables held under this act and a copy of its by-laws and give the names of its officers. Report to L.-G. in Council.

## CHAP. 143

An Act to amend the act to incorporate *La Maison des Etudiants*

[Assented to 27th April, 1909]

**W**HEREAS *La Maison des Etudiants*, has, by its petition, Preamble. represented that it is expedient to amend its charter, the act 2 Edward VII, chapter 104, and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Section 10 of the act 2 Edward VII, chapter 104, is re- 2 Ed. VII, c. 104, s. 10, replaced. placed by the following :

" 10. The administration of all the affairs of the corporation shall be confided to an administrative council chosen in the manner provided by the by-laws, which shall manage the affairs directly or through committees and choose its officers who shall form the executive board and be the officers of the corporation. The council shall exercise all the rights and powers of the corporation except as regards the alienation of immoveables and shall render an account yearly to the general meeting. Administrative council, &c. Its powers.

The following shall be members of the council: the rector and secretary of Laval University in Montreal, *ex-officio*, a professor of each of the faculties and schools the students whereof are members of the corporation, one of the administrators and one of the governors of the said university, two of the charter or perpetual members of the corporation, two of the active members who have obtained their degrees representing all the students who are graduates, and an active student member of each of the said schools or faculties, appointed by their re- Members of council.

spective colleagues or in the manner provided by the by-laws of the corporation.

The charter members now members of the administrative council shall remain members during their good pleasure and until they shall resign of their own accord."

**2.** The following section is inserted in the said act after section 13 :

Assessment upon certain students by faculties of certain university, &c.

" **13a.** Every faculty or school of Laval University, in Montreal or affiliated with the said university, may levy by resolution upon its students and collect from them for the benefit of *La Maison des Etudiants* a yearly assessment fixed by the by-laws of the corporation not exceeding five dollars or may order that the yearly assessment imposed by *La Maison des Etudiants* on its members, shall be collected by the treasurer of each of the said faculties or schools and that the payment thereof shall be obligatory for every student in the same manner as the payment for lectures or other dues imposed on the students following the course of any of the said faculties or schools and as if such assessment had been imposed by them and for them.

Assessment of students by administrators, &c.

The administrators of the said university may also by resolution impose the said assessment and exact the payment thereof from any student attending any of the schools or faculties of the said university, for the benefit of the corporation. The assessment already imposed in certain of the said faculties or schools and the collection thereof, are declared to have been legally affected, to all intents and purposes.

Coming into force.

**3.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

## CHAP. 144

An Act to incorporate *La Corporation agricole et industrielle des missionnaires du Saint Esprit*

[Assented to 27th April, 1909]

Preamble.
