

according to the municipal valuation. The said corporation may also hypothecate its immoveables.

By-laws **4.** The corporation may make, amend and repeal, regulations and by-laws, not contrary to law, which it may deem useful or necessary for its interests and government.

Procurators. **5.** One or more procurators may be appointed for the transaction of business.

Vault or cemetery.
Proviso. **6.** The corporation may have a vault or cemetery on its property for the burial of the mortal remains of its members, provided it complies with the laws, prescriptions and regulations enacted with reference to such matter.

Corporate seat. **7.** The corporate seat of the corporation shall be at St. Alexandre de la Gatineau, in the township of Hull, in the county of Ottawa.

Report to Lieut.-Gov. in Council. **8.** The corporation shall, when required so to do by the Provincial Secretary, transmit to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, a detailed statement of its property, the names of its officers and agents, and a certified copy of its rules and regulations.

Coming into force. **9.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 145

An Act respecting The Ottawa Golf Club

[Assented to 27th April, 1909]

Preamble. **W**HEREAS, The Ottawa Golf Club has presented a petition, praying that its charter as contained in the Act 7 Edward VII, chapter 131, be amended as hereinafter set forth and it is expedient to grant such prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

7 Ed. VII, c. 131, s. 12 added. **1.** The act 7 Edward VII, chapter 131, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section :

63 V., c. 12, s. 46, subs. 3, **" 12.** Sub-section 3 of section 46 of the act 63 Victoria,

chapter 12 shall not apply to the club, but the club shall be not to apply treated as coming under sub-section 2 of the said section 46." to club, &c.

CHAP. 146

An Act to incorporate "*L'Association de l'Arsenal du 65ième Régiment C.M.R.*"

[Assented to 7th May, 1909]

WHEREAS Lieutenant-Colonel Alfred E. Labelle, Major Preamble.

Léonard G. de Tonnancour, Major Ernest J. Peltier, and the officers of the 65th regiment of the Militia of Canada, known as "*Carabiniers Mont-Royal*", of Canada, have, by their petition, represented that they wish to be incorporated as an association for the purpose of owning and maintaining a regimental armoury in the city of Montreal, and for other regimental purposes, and that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth ; and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Lieutenant-Colonel Alfred E. Labelle, Major Léonard G. Persons in-
de Tonnancour, Major Ernest J. Peltier, all of the city of ^{incorporated.}
Montreal, and the other active commissioned officers, either
present or future, of the 65th regiment of the Militia of Canada,
now known as "*Carabiniers Mont-Royal*", are incorporated
under the name of "*L'Association de l'Arsenal du 65ième* Name.
Régiment C.M.R.", hereinafter called "the Association".

2. The said Lieutenant-Colonel Alfred E. Labelle, Major Provisional
Léonard G. de Tonnancour, and Major Ernest J. Peltier, shall be ^{committee.}
the first or provisional committee of the association, and shall
continue in office until replaced by a committee elected accord-
ing to the by-laws of the association.

3. The head office of the association shall be in the city of Head office
Montreal, in the Province of Quebec.

4. The first general meeting of the association for organiza- First general
tion, the passing of by-laws and other business, shall be held ^{meeting.}
