CHAP. 22

An Act to amend the Revised Statutes respecting Cemetery
Companies

[Assented to 20th May, 1905]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Leg-
islative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of
Quebec, enacts as follows :

R. S., 3457*a*, **1.** Article 3457*a* of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by
amended. the act 54 Victoria, chapter 31, section 1, is amended by
adding thereto the words : “and every cemetery company,
lawfully incorporated, may likewise obtain by expropriation
the land necessary for establishing or enlarging its cemetery.”

CHAP. 23

Ant Act to amend the Notarial Code

[Assented to 11th May, 1905]

HIS MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Leg-
islative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of
Quebec, enacts as follows :

Art. added **1.** The following article is added after article 3812 of the

3812.

“**3812*a*.** 1. Every holder of a degree of Bachelor of
Holders of Arts, Bachelor of Sciences or Bachelor of Letters, conferred
degrees may upon him by any Canadian or British University, may pass a

2. The clerkship of such person holding such degree shall count from the registration of such deed, provided such person has obtained from the Board, upon payment of a fee of one hundred dollars, a by-law for that purpose.” Date from which clerkship counts.

2. The Board may, by by-law, declare that the clerkship of holders of a degree of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Letters, who have been up to this date admitted to study the profession, commenced from the date of the registration of their deed of indenture, although such deeds had been passed before such holders had been authorized to study. CHAP. 24

An Act to supplement the act 4 Edward VII, chapter 26

[Assented to 20th May, 1905]

WHEREAS the Legislature of Quebec, during the session of 1904, passed an act to repeal the act 60 Victoria, chapter 40 ; Preamble.

Whereas, in consequence of such legislation, the notaries affected by the said act 60 Victoria, chapter 40, may have considered themselves lawfully authorized to practise their profession and may have passed deeds accordingly ;

Whereas grave doubts might exist as to the validity of such deeds, and it is expedient, in the public interest, that such doubts be removed ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. All deeds that may have been drawn up and passed before the coming into force of this act, by notaries to whom the conditions provided for by the act 60 Victoria, chapter 40, may apply, are declared authentic and to have been validly passed and received by them. Certain deeds declared authentic, and to have been validly passed.

2. This act shall not affect pending cases. Pending cases.
