

CHAP. 41

An Act to amend the act 3 Edward VII, chapter 62,
amending the charter of the city of Montreal

[Assented to 11th May, 1905]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Dame Lily M. Macaulay, wife separate as to property by contract of marriage of Charles Cushing, of the city of Montreal, notary, and the said Charles Cushing; Thomas George Roddick, physician; Robertson Macaulay, president of the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada; Charles Alexander, confectioner; Samuel Hamilton Ewing, vice-president of the Molson's Bank; Thomas B. Macaulay, actuary, and William F. Lighthall, notary, all of the said city of Montreal, esquires, have, by their petition, represented that it is desirable and in the public interest that the act 3 Edward VII, chapter 62, be amended, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. Paragraph 13 of section 52 of chapter 62 of the act 3 Edward VII, is repealed.

2. The following section is inserted in the act 3 Edward VII, chapter 62, after section 56:

Opening of
part of Mac-
Kay street.

“**56a.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the city of Montreal shall open Mackay street, from Dorchester street, in a southerly direction, to a depth of one hundred and twenty feet, through subdivision 21 of lot No. 1565 on the official plan and book of reference of St. Antoine Ward of the city of Montreal.

Payment of
cost thereof.

One half of the total cost of the said opening shall be paid by the city of Montreal, and the other half shall be assessed upon the immoveable property of St. Andrew's Ward of the city of Montreal, in which the property to be expropriated is situated, in accordance with the provisions of the paragraph of the city charter referring to expropriations in the general interest.

When to be
commenced,
&c.

The said opening and expropriation shall be commenced by the said city on or before the first of July, 1905, and shall be completed by the first of July, 1906.”

Coming into

3. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
