CHAP. 105

An Act to incorporate *Les Religieuses Missionnaires de Notre-Dame d'Afrique*

[Assented to 2nd June, 1904]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Reverend Sisters Marie Mischler, called Sister Ste. Marcienne; Josephine Peiron, called Sister St. Charles Borromée, Marie Bourque, called Sister Ste. Claire, and Jeanne Truge, called Sister St. Siméon, *Religieuses Missionnaires de Notre-Dame d'Afrique*, have by their petition represented :

That they have founded, in the city of Quebec, with the approval of His Grace *Monseigneur* L. N. Bégin, Archbishop of Quebec, an establishment of their order with the view of training missionaries for their missions in Africa;

That to attain their ends they need to acquire and possess property, and for such purpose desire to be incorporated;

Whereas they have prayed to be incorporated, and it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

Persons in-
corporated.

1. The Reverend Sisters Marie Mischler, called Sister Ste. Marcienne; Josephine Peiron, called Sister St. Charles Borromée; Marie Bourque, called Sister Ste. Claire; Jeanne Truge, called Sister St. Siméon, and all other persons who, in virtue of the constitution or by-laws of their order, shall join or succeed them, are hereby incorporated under the name of "*Les Religieuses Missionnaires de Notre-Dame d'Afrique*."

Name.

Succession
and seal.

2. The corporation shall have perpetual succession and may have a common seal which it may change at will.

Corporate
powers.

3. The corporation may :

(a) Appear before the courts in the same manner as any other person;

- (b) Accept, acquire, possess, by any legal title, moveable and immoveable properties, provided the value of the immoveables acquired shall not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars according to municipal valuation ;
- (c) Lease, hypothecate, sell, exchange, or otherwise alienate, by any title whatsoever, all its moveable and immoveable property ;
- (d) Adopt by-laws respecting its internal government and administration and disposal of its property and amend or repeal the same when necessary ;
- (e) Appoint officers, procurators and administrators and define their respective powers.

4. The signatures of the superioress and *depositaire* of *Les Religieuses Missionnaires de Notre-Dame d'Afrique* in this province shall bind the corporation for all its affairs. Signatures binding on corporation.

5. The corporate seat of the corporation shall be in the city of Quebec, but may be changed by by-law duly adopted by the corporation, provided it be in the Province of Quebec, after a notice in the *Quebec Official Gazette* and in an English and French newspaper during six months. Corporate seat and change thereof.

6. The corporation shall, whenever so required by the Lieutenant-Governor in council, transmit to the Provincial Secretary a statement of the immoveables it possesses. Return to Provincial Secretary.

7. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction Coming into force.

C H A P . 106

An Act to incorporate *Les Missionnaires du Sacré-Cœur*

[Assented to 2nd June, 1904]

WHEREAS the Reverend Fathers Louis Jourdon, superior, Pierre Courbon, director, and François Barral, bursar, all three of the city of Quebec, *Missionnaires du Sacré-Cœur*, have, by their petition, represented : Preamble.

That they have founded, in the city of Quebec, with the approval of His Grace *Monseigneur Bégin*, Archbishop of Quebec, an establishment of their order with the view of training missionaries for their missions and of education ;

That to attain their ends they need to acquire and possess property and, for such purpose, desire to be incorporated ;

Whereas they have prayed to be constituted a civil corporation and it is expedient to grant their prayer ;
