

That he has already matriculated in the law faculty of Laval University and has been indentured as a student at law with Ernest Roy, esquire, advocate, of Quebec;

That he has not passed his examination for admission to study for certain reasons set forth in a petition addressed by him to the general council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, asking it to approve his application for the passing of a private bill;

That the said general council of the Bar of the Province of Quebec, at its session of the 13th June, 1903, unanimously approved of the said petition;

Whereas the petitioner has prayed that an act be passed to that effect and it is expedient to grant his prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The Bar of the Province of Quebec is authorized to admit Oscar Jules Morin to the profession of advocate, when he shall have duly obtained his university degrees and the required certificate from his patron, and after he shall have passed the examinations required by law for admission to practise the said profession.

CHAP. 124

An Act to authorize the Board of Notaries of the Province of Quebec to admit Thomas Arthur Cimon to the practice of the notarial profession after examination

[Assented to 2nd June, 1904]

WHEREAS Thomas Arthur Cimon, notarial student, heretofore of La Baie St. Paul, and now of the city of Quebec, has by his petition represented:

Preamble.

That he has followed a complete course of classical and scientific studies, and has obtained a diploma of bachelor of letters from Laval University, dated the 1st July, 1902;

That for reasons beyond his control he was unable to be admitted to the study of the notarial profession by the Board of Notaries at its session of the month of July, 1902;

That he was, nevertheless, indentured as a student with Louis Parant, notary, at Quebec, on the 17th September, 1802;
