

given or bequeathed or which may hereafter be given or bequeathed for the poor of the said parish of St. Joseph de Lévis and for other charitable purposes under any will or deed of gift.

Purposes of
corporation.

8. The corporation may devote itself to such occupations as may be calculated to aid it in maintaining itself and carrying on the various works connected with its constitution, such as the care of the aged poor and infirm of both sexes, orphan asylums, schools of house-keeping, the care of idiots and insane of both sexes, and the receiving ladies or lay boarders who wish to live in their establishment.

Cemetery.

9. The corporation may have its cemetery on its property for the mortal remains of its members and patients, provided it complies with the laws, provisions and regulations enacted by civil authority.

Return to
Lieutenant-
Governor.

10. The corporation shall be bound, whenever required, to make to the Lieutenant-Governor such report as he may exact.

Coming into
force.

11. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.

CHAP. 119

An Act to incorporate the Murray Bay Convalescent Home

[Assented to 25th April, 1903]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter mentioned have, by petition, represented that they and others for some years past, have maintained by voluntary contributions a certain institution at Pointe au Pic, Province of Quebec, known as the Murray Bay Convalescent Home, for the purpose of furnishing a home for convalescents, and have prayed that, for the better attainment of the objects of the said institution, the same may be vested with corporate powers; and whereas it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Stearns, and such other persons as may hereafter be associated with them in conformity with this act, and their successors, are hereby constituted and created a body corporate and politic, with all the rights incident to corporations by the name of " The Name. Murray Bay Convalescent Home."

2. The corporation shall have perpetual succession and may, under the said name, contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, prosecute and be prosecuted, in all courts ; and by the same name they and their successors, from time to time, and at all times hereafter, shall be capable to have, take, receive, purchase and acquire, hold, possess and enjoy and maintain, to and for the use of the said corporation, all lands and property, moveable and immoveable, either now held in trust for them or which may hereafter be sold, ceded, exchanged, given, bequeathed or granted to the said corporation, and to sell, hypothecate, alienate, convey, let or lease the same, if need be ; provided always that such real estate does not exceed the annual value of five thousand dollars beyond that actually required for the use of the corporation.

3. The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a board of directors, the first board (which shall hold office for a year) to be named by the above named persons, at their first meeting.

4. The directors shall have power to form a code of by-laws, not inconsistent with the laws of this province or of the Dominion, for fixing the terms of admission of members, for the government of the same, for the election and changing of officers, and for the general regulation and management of the affairs of the corporation ; which code, when formed and adopted at a regular meeting of directors, shall, until modified or rescinded by the corporation, be equally binding as this act upon the institution, its officers and its members.

5. The board of directors may appoint a committee of management and an executive committee which shall have such powers as are delegated to them by the board of directors and defined in the by-laws.

6. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
