

4. The concluding paragraph of section 5 of the act 42-43 Victoria, chapter 75, embracing the following words : " but no alienation of any further portion of such property shall be made," is repealed. 42-43 V., c. 75, s. 5, amended.

CHAP. 125

An Act to incorporate *La Congrégation des Servantes de Jésus-Marie*

[Assented to 25th April, 1903]

WHEREAS Eléonore Potvin, in religion Sister Marie Zita de Jésus ; Sophie Chauvin, in religion Sister Marie Delphine ; Amanda Ricard, in religion Sister Marie de la Croix ; Anna Robert, in religion Sister Marie Antoine, and Philomène Langlois, in religion Sister Marie Bernard, all of the city of Hull, in the county of Ottawa, and at present members of the community called *La Congrégation des Servantes de Jésus-Marie*, have, by their petition, prayed for an act to incorporate them under the name of *La Congrégation des Servantes de Jésus-Marie*, for the following amongst other objects : to devote themselves in common to such works of piety, mercy and charity as the life of contemplation they lead may allow, with power to establish, in this province, novitiates, buildings, convents, establishments and monasteries, and for such purpose to acquire moveable and immoveable property, and generally to manage and administer their affairs under such corporate name ; Preamble

And whereas, it is expedient to incorporate them ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. Eléonore Potvin, in religion Sister Marie Zita de Jésus ; Sophie Chauvin, in religion Sister Marie Delphine ; Amanda Ricard, in religion Sister Marie de la Croix ; Anna Robert, in religion Sister Marie Antoine, and Philomène Langlois, in religion Sister Marie Bernard, all of the city of Hull, in the county of Ottawa, and at present members of the community called *La Congrégation des Servantes de Jésus-Marie*, and all persons who now or shall hereafter form part of the said community, in accordance with its rules, statutes and by-laws, are incorporated under the name of *La Congrégation des Servantes de Jésus-Marie*. Persons incorporated.

Corporate powers.

2. The corporation hereby constituted shall have perpetual succession. It may have a common seal and alter the same at will ; appear before the courts in the same manner as any person ; borrow money, sign bills of exchange and promissory notes ; hold, accept and acquire, by any legal title, moveable and immoveable property, which it may sell, alienate, hypothecate, assign, lease, transfer, exchange or otherwise, at any time, dispose of by any title whatsoever ; provided always that the yearly revenue from the immoveables held by the said community shall not exceed twenty thousand dollars, which revenue shall be employed for the purposes of the said corporation.

Corporate seat.

3. The corporate seat of the corporation shall be in the city of Hull, in the county of Ottawa, Province of Quebec, but may be changed by the corporation, if it deems necessary, upon publishing a notice in the *Quebec Official Gazette*.

Rules to govern corporation and by-laws to be made by it.

4. The corporation shall be governed by the rules of the community, and it may adopt by-laws or rules, which it may afterwards amend or repeal, regarding the administration of its property, the direction and government of its houses or establishments, the election, number, and powers of its directresses and officers, the attributes of each of its members, their admission and removal, and generally adopt or pass all by-laws, not contrary to law, connected with the purposes of the said corporation.

Novitiates, &c., may be established.

5. The corporation may found, establish and maintain, in any place within this province, novitiates, convents, establishments, monasteries, or branches, and it may erect such buildings as may be suitable for its objects in every locality in which it may have an establishment ; it may also have a cemetery in connection with such convents or monasteries, subject to the authorization and formalities required by law, but on condition that, within the limits of a town or city, burials can be in an underground chapel only.

Officers.

6. The corporation may appoint officers, procurators or administrators from amongst its members and define their powers ; it may also appoint one or more procurators outside of the community.

Documents how to be signed to bind corporation.

7. Every document, bearing the signature of the superior and of the econome of one of the establishments of the corporation, accompanied by a copy, under seal, of the minutes of the council of the congregation approving such document, shall be deemed to be binding upon the corporation, provided that in the case of a document emanating from a

branch, it bear also the signature of the superioress in chief (*supérieure majeure*) residing at the corporate seat of the community or be confirmed by her by means of a separate document.

8. The corporation shall, when so required by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, transmit a statement of the immoveables held by it, in virtue of this act. Return to Lieutenant-Governor.

9. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.

C H A P. 1 2 6

An Act to incorporate *Les Frères Mineurs Capucins de Québec*

[Assented to 25th April, 1903]

WHEREAS Georges Déroutier, in religion Brother Alexis de Barbezieux, vicar provincial; Juste Gaillot, in religion Brother Albert de Pisani, and Clement Vigneaux, in religion Brother Vital de Lonbersan, all of Limoilou, Minor Capuchin Friars, have, by their petition, represented that they have founded, in Limoilou, an establishment of their order, with the approval of His Grace *Monseigneur* Louis Nazaïre Bégin, archbishop of Quebec, and have, at his request, taken charge of the parish; Preamble.

Whereas they have petitioned to be constituted a civil corporation, and it is expedient to grant their prayer;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows:

1. The said Reverend Brothers Alexis de Barbezieux, Albert de Pisani and Vital de Lonbersan, and such persons as according to their rules or by-laws, statutes and regulations now are, or shall hereafter become members of their order, are constituted a corporation under the name of *Les Frères Mineurs Capucins de Québec*. Certain persons incorporated.

2. The corporation shall have perpetual succession and may have a common seal, which it may change at will. Succession and seal.

3. The corporation may:

(a) With the consent of the diocesan authority, establish novitiates in this province, take charge of parishes and missions and perform general ecclesiastical duties;
