

## CH A P. 131

An Act to make further provisions respecting the estate of  
Horace Dryden Clark

[Assented to 25th April, 1903]

**W**HEREAS Mary M. Clark, of Hartford, in the State of Connecticut, one of the United States of America, duly authorized by her husband Henry A. Huntington, of the same place, attorney-at-law, has, by petition, represented that she is one of the children of the late Horace Dryden Clark, in his lifetime of West Suffield in the said State ; that her brothers Walter F. Clark and Dryden O. Clark have died without leaving issue, and that she has only been once married, namely to the said Henry A. Huntington, but that no children have been born of the said marriage, to whom, under the provisions of the act 52 Victoria, chapter 101, section 5, subsection 2, the income arising from two houses described in the will of the said late Horace Dryden Clark as one hundred and one and one hundred and three Union Avenue, could be paid, and that the said income has, since the deaths of the said Walter F. Clark and Dryden O. Clark respectively, been accumulated and is now in the hands of the trustee appointed under the said act ; and whereas she has prayed that an act be passed to remove any doubts as to the effect of the said act, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

**1.** Notwithstanding anything contained in the act of the Legislature of the Province of Quebec, 52 Victoria, chapter 101, it is hereby declared that the income and revenue derived or derivable from the houses and property described in effect in the will of the said late Horace Dryden Clark as the dwelling house number one hundred and three and the lot on which it stands in Union Avenue and the dwelling house number one hundred and one and the lot on which it stands in Union Avenue, both in the city of Montreal, have been and are payable, since the deaths of Walter F. Clark and Dryden O. Clark, respectively, to such persons as would have been entitled under said will if the said act had not been passed.

Certain income declared payable to certain persons under will of H. D. Clark, notwithstanding provisions of 52 V. c. 101.

**2.** This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
