An Act to authorize Herménégilde C. Demers to practise the profession of pharmacist in the Province of Quebec

[Assented to 25th April, 1903]

WHEREAS Herménégilde C. Demers, pharmacist, here- Preamble.
tofore of the town of Southbridge, now of the town of Farnham, after having consulted the Board of Directors of the Pharmaceutical Association of the Province of Quebec as to the expediency of the passing of this act, has, by his petition, represented :

That he has followed a course of commercial and classical studies in educational institutions in the Province of Quebec ;

That he studied pharmacy for eight years, from 1884 to 1892, namely : two in the Province of Quebec and six in the United States ;

That, in the year 1892, he successfully passed the examination required by the Board of Commissioners of Pharmacy of the State of Massachusetts, and obtained from that board a certificate as a pharmacist, allowing him to practise as such ;

That he has constantly since then kept a pharmacy in the towns of Webster and Southbridge respectively, until he decided to return to his native country, and to settle in the town of Farnham ;

That he wishes to continue to live in the Province of Quebec and to practise his profession therein ;

That, through his studies and experience, he possesses the necessary knowledge and capacity for keeping a pharmacy ;

Whereas he has prayed for the passing of an act authorizing him to become a member of the Pharmaceutical Association of the Province of Quebec, and it is expedient to grant his prayer ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

1. The Pharmaceutical Association of the Province of Quebec is hereby authorized to grant the said Herménégilde C. Demers a license as a pharmacist in this province, with all the privileges connected therewith, on presentation of his diploma and certificate as pharmacist, after an oral examination. Admission of H. C. Demers as pharmacist.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction. Coming into force.
