An Act to authorize the admission of Paul d'Aigneaux to the practice of the profession of land surveyor, after examination.

[Assented to 25th April, 1903]

Preamble.

WHEREAS Paul d'Aigneaux, of the city of Quebec, has, by petition, represented :

That he followed a complete course at the University of Paris and obtained a certificate of Bachelor of Letters and Sciences ;

That he followed the course of study required for admission to the special military school of St. Cyr (three years in the *Ecole Ste. Geneviève*, Paris) ;

That he attended the military school of St. Cyr for two years, following the theoretical and practical studies of geographical and topographical surveying ;

That while in the 25th regiment of infantry of the French army, he was for three years employed in topographical work, outside of the regular service ;

That, owing to the said five years of study and three years of practical experience, he possesses the necessary knowledge for the practice of the profession of land surveyor ;

That he has passed none of the examinations required by the laws of the Province of Quebec with respect to land surveyors ;

Whereas he has prayed to be admitted to the practice of the profession of land surveyor, after a studentship of twelve months, two of which to be spent in field work, and after the examination required by law for admission to practice ;

Whereas the board of management of the land surveyors of the Province of Quebec, has approved such petition, and whereas it is expedient to grant his prayer ;

Therefore, His Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, enacts as follows :

Admission of
P. d'Aigneaux
as land sur-
veyor.

1. The board of management of land surveyors of the Province of Quebec is hereby authorized to admit Paul d'Aigneaux to the practice of the profession of land surveyor and to deliver him the certificates required after a studentship of twelve months, two of which to be spent in field work, and after the examination required for admission to practice.

Coming into
force.

2. This act shall come into force on the day of its sanction.
